DEAN'S MESSAGE HAPPY NEW YEAR

What are organ plans for the New Year? Joyce Jones said we should learn at least four new bit works each year. How do you find time to work on these? How do you fit them into your services? Let me know the hints and ideas you have.

A friend recently handed me an article from the Wall Street Journal about the process of building a pipe organ. This happened to be about **Schantz**, but I'm sure it applies to any pipe organ manufacturer. Here are some of the highlights:

This company, founded in 1873, is still profitable and business is steady, with about one organ completed monthly. On average, it takes 4-6 months to build an organ. An order placed today wouldn't START production until April 2008. The company has only 92 employees, half of them from nearby farms where they learned woodworking and mechanical skills while growing up. This gives the company deep community roots.

It takes a worker 30-40 hours of hand labor to build a rank with small pipes. A complete single rank is built by only one worker. They have no quality control people, because they know who to "blame" for a problem. Each seam is hand-dabbed with solder. The shorter pipes use an alloy of lead and tin to be highly pliable. The longer pipes are cut from tougher sheets of zinc because they need to be stronger. One of their few computer mechanized machines is a router for cutting out the wooden grillwork. This is one place where we've "outsourced" to a "cheaper labor supply". It takes 4-5 years to become a good pipe maker, and voicers each spend as much as 7 years as an apprentice. The voicers work with a machine like a stripped down organ with a keyboard that slides along a track as he tunes each one.

\$80 million dollars worth of pipe organs are sold in the US yearly. Global competition comes from Britain and Europe. The biggest competitor to US made organs is Casavant

Wonder why they're so expensive? An elaborate pipe organ can cost as much as \$2 million. Labor costs run an astounding 57%. The average US manufacturer has labor costs of about 17%, and those highly mechanized can be as low as 2%! This company also does a brisk business in refurbishing old pipe organs.

Three of their 4 top executive are actually organists who have Sunday jobs. Interestingly enough, Mr. Schantz himself (great grandson of the founder and current CEO) is not an organist.

The industry faces challenges from the growth of new-style churches that often have no organ, from the gradual decline in numbers of mainline denominations, and from new computer technology which more closely copies the rich pipe organ sounds.

Member's Recital, November 19th DIANE KELLER

The annual member's recital was held on November 19th at **St. Joseph's Church** in Mt. View. The recital raised scholarship funds and also celebrated the centennial of the Murray Harris organ. The 1906 organ has a colorful history having survived an earthquake and two fires. It survived the 1906 earthquake and the fire that followed and burned its church home to the ground. The organ was installed in Mt. View in 1926 and was said to be the first pipe organ in that town, until the original St. Joseph's church was destroyed by fire in 1928. The organ again survived, although it was badly damaged. It has been repaired and renovated, most recently in 1981.

We were treated to a fabulous concert and informative narration from sub-dean Melanie Cervi in full period costume. Pat Eldred, Andrew Birling, Mary Ann Gee, and Pat Mistead performed a variety of pieces that would have been heard around the turn of the century. Cathleen Kalcic from St. Joseph's church also performed two art songs. Many thanks to the St. Joseph parish for sharing their organ with us and to the performers and Melanie for a wonderful afternoon.

New Dupré Improvisations to be Premiered, January 7th, 3:00 PM

On January 7th at 3:30 p.m., the **Music Department of St. Mary's Cathedral** (Geary and Gough Streets) will present a unique and historic recital, the first performances of four transcriptions of improvisations by Marcel Dupré. The two improvised Communion Meditations, from St. Sulpice on January 17, 1971; and the Recitatif and Final, from a recording at the Dupré residence in 1949, have been transcribed and reconstructed **b Dr. David A. Stech**, Professor of Music at the University of Alaska, Fairbanks.

Dr. Stech will be in attendance at the recital, given by Assistant Cathedral Organist **David Hatt**, which will also include Dr. Stech's previously-published transcriptions of two choraleversets on Veni Creator Spiritus and eleven versets performed at the dedication of the Beuchet-Debierre organ at St. Louis des Invalides in Paris. This will be the first known complete performance of the eleven versets. Also, this set, which was improvised by Dupré fifty years ago, will include intonations by Cathedral Cantor Stephen Walsh.

The program will be followed at 5:30 p.m. by Candlelight Epiphany Lessons and Carols. Both performances are free and open to the public.
