Millennia Too!, an ensemble of Alison J. Luedecke on organ and Susan Barrett on oboe and oboe damore, performed a program of selections from Renaissance to Modern at the Presbyterian Church of Los Gatos, Los Gatos, California. The opening piece, Johann Hertel's *Partita in C*, featured oboe and organ.

Two pieces, one by John Karl Hirten and the other by Maurice Durufle, featured the chant, *Veni Creator* Spiritus. The remaining selections ranged from Bach to modern pieces written especially for Millennia Too! by Mary Beth Bennett, Craig Phillips, Jon Naples and Hirten.


The program was sponsored by the San Jose Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. The organ is an M.P. Moeller, 3 manual, that was recently restored by Schoenstein & Co. – **Darryl Parker** &

Sunday afternoon, March 18, **Dr. Alison Luedecke** (organ) and **Susan Barrett** (oboe) presented a lovely concert at **the Presbyterian Church of Los Gatos**. Susan and Alison have performed together for over a decade and their sensitivity to the music and each other is evident. They have recorded two compact discs together. Alison is a native of Galveston, Texas, and she received her DMA at Eastman as a student of David Craighead. Susan lives in San Diego and is Principal Oboe with the San Diego Chamber Orchestra and Classics 4 Kids Philharmonic.

They performed a varied program with five pieces composed by living composers. Most of them are personal friends of Alison. The opening number was "Partita in C" by Johann Hertel (1727-1789.) Alison commented that this piece was one in the rococo period. Two pieces were based on "Veni Creator," one by Durufle and the other by John Karl Hirten (b. 1956.) Bach was represented by "Sonata in E Flat" and "Piece d'Orgue" Another piece by Hirten was "Summer Carol," which I particularly liked. It had Celtic sounds and they had played it at weddings. "Chant Mystique" by Mary Beth Bennett was a pleasant piece, but not really based on chant melody. The penultimate piece was "Nightsong" by Craig Phillips (b. 1960) followed by "Foliage" by Jon Naples (b. 1954.) The four seasons were the four movements of the piece "Foliage," with the last three movements being my favorite. – Mary Jane Judge &



ORGANLIVE PROVIDES MUSIC OF THE ORGAN AROUND THE WORLD

Organlive.com is an Internet audio station dedicated to the music of the classical organ. Broadcasting since August 2003, Organlive has become the most-heard organ station on the Internet with the largest library of music online. The ever-growing library currently holds over 5,900 tracks from more than 500 albums of music recorded by organists all over the world **Organlive** plays albums recorded on pipe, digital, and combination organs played by the world's best concert organists, as well as tracks recorded and submitted by less renowned organists. Included are pairings of organ and orchestra, solo instruments, choir, or vocal solos. The listener is presented with the work title, composer, album title, a link to purchase the album online, the organ, it's builder, size, and location, and a link to the specification of the organ being heard. Listeners may browse the entire library searching by work, composer, organist, album, or organ and request tracks to be played. The broadcast is completely free to anyone with a broadband Internet connection and only requires the quick, automatic installation of a browser-based player to tune in. Listeners can also tune in via Windows Media Player, WinAmp, iTunes, or any MP3 player. The audio stream reaches over 100 countries around the world, with more than 300 listeners per day tuning in. The station is funded by the listeners, and an annual budget covering all operating expenses is raised every spring. **Organlive** is always accepting submissions for new music from organists, composers, and publishers. HIGH TECH COUNTRY WELCOMES HIGH TECH ORGAN Mount Hermon Christian Center Hector Olivera, Organ

Internationally acclaimed organist **Hector Olivera** empassioned the audience of hundreds Wednesday night, Janaury 24, when he performed the Third Inaugural Concert of the Patricia Witham Mount Hermon Organ at the **Mount Hermon Christian Center** in Felton, CA.

Playing on the "King of Instruments", Mr. Olivera generated incredible sounds many in the audience had never heard from the organ, which features four manuals, 161 wooden draw knobs, six divisions and a 193-rank pipe equivalent. The concert also featured **Dave Talbott**, Mount Hermon's Resident Musician who served as emcee and guest organist.

Most famous for his amazing technical mastery, Mr. Olivera moved effortlessly from classical masterpieces to popular interpretations with amazing energy and dexterity. He also entertained, with his quick wit and lively personality, making the entire performance a true joy to experience.

Throughout the performance, Mr. Olivera's stuffed friend and sidekick "Harry the Frog" sat with attention atop the organ, listening quietly to every note. Hector and Harry travel together in the Harrymobile, a truck customized two years ago to house the traveling Roland Atelier (The Queen) and the Rogers Trillium (The King) and thereby enabling Mr.Olivera to bring organ music to audiences throughout the country. Among many critically acclaimed performances, the gifted musician has appeared with the Cleveland Orchestra, Dallas Symphony, Minnesota Orchestra and Amsterdam Baroque Ensemble.

Hector Olivera, considered by his peers and organ fans to be one of the finest organists in the world today, performs not only at home but also abroad in prestigious churches, cathedrals and concert halls. This August, the worldrenowned organist will bring music to Paris, where he was invited to perform a concert on the world's most prestigious pipe organ at the Notre Dame Cathedral. The Rodgers Four-Manual Organ encompasses all of the Rodger's advanced Trillium technology with incredible organ voices. The instrument, designed in 2004, was originally intended to serve as a loaner to dealers for special concerts. It was only sent out a few times, however, and later considered too large for easy transport. It was ultimately purchased by friends of Patricia Witham and donated to Mount Hermon where it remains today.

The Mount Hermon Christian Conference Center in downtown Felton is just a few miles up Highway 17 from the Silicon Valley off Mount Hermon Road.
