

Update on David Wills Our Frasier Scholar

Hello all! Here's an update from Portland. My Frasier scholarship money is subsidizing my organ lessons. I am awarded credit for my continued studies at Reed. My primary practice organ is a 2-manual Jardine tracker organ. My lessons are held once a week at Lewis & Clark on their strange and lovely Casavant, noted for its suspended pipes dangling in the center of the hexagonal chapel. Trinity Cathedral's Rosales located a short, \$1.75 bus ride from Reed – I've been over there a few times for concerts already. I'm studying organ with Lee Garrett, organ curator for Lewis & Clark. I have just begun lessons on the harpsichord with a member of the music department faculty at Reed, Bonnie Garrett, the wife of my organ teacher.

The nonmusical sector of my life has also been filled with reading, papers, moving in and getting acquainted with my dorm, the college, and the greater area. Also, I am striking up friendships with an array of characters – students and faculty alike – and coming to terms with the inescapable constant gray drizzle in all of my transportation considerations.

For many organists who spend their lives playing smaller instruments, hearing a recording like this on a really fine small instrument played beautifully by a sensitive and creative artist is a true delight. The organ at Holy Cross Church, Opus 506 of the Felgemaker company, and rebuild by Steuart Goodwin in 1987-1988 is an 18-stop instrument. It reminds this reviewer that a truly fine small, colorful, well-built instrument provides a great variety of color, flexibility and musical nuance, all well displayed by this recording that takes its inspiration from presenting the variation from in all its permutations.

The two well-known works on this recording are Bach's monumental *Passacaglia*, BWV 582, and Felix Mendelssohn's *Sonatas*, op. 65, based on the Lutheran hymn tune setting of the Lord's Prayer, *Vater Unser im Himmelreich*. Again, this reminds this reviewer of just how flexible an instrument of 18 stops can be to bring these masterworks alive under the hands of an artist such as Ms. Kvamme.

American Guild of Organists International Year of the Organ 2008-2009

Organ Spectacular 19 October 2008 On Sunday, Oct 25 at **St. Mary's Catholic Church** in Los Gatos, San Jose Chapter Guild members, joined with 225 other organ concerts presented that day to acknowledge the International Year of the Organ. AROUND THE WORLD IN 80 MINUTES was a quick international tour of organ music past and present. The concert opened in Italy with **Andrew Birling** playing and chanting Salvatore's Italian *Kyrie*, followed by Franck's powerful Chorale #3 from France by **Joyce Rhodes**. **Michael Cala** preceded his Stanley *Voluntary* by an appropriate improvised intro on *Rule Brittania*. **Lothar Bandermann** treated us to his arragment of *We Walk By Faith* and an amusing variations on a Russian folksong *Kind Beetle*. Nigeria and Hungary were represented by **Melanie Cervi** and **Carolyn Pryor**. **Mary Ann Gee**

and guest flautist **Sheri Woodhouse** gave us Germany's *Ornaments of Grace*, then Mary Ann played *Ein Feste Burg* (Nagel) with a strong jazz influence. **Pat Milstead** brought a touch of Mexico with two pieces by Ramon Noble. The program closed in America with **Valerie Sterk's** own *Variation on McKee* for a festive ending. The program was followed by a reception chaired by **Kay Lee** with setup assistance from Andrew and Mike. Our thanks to chair and SubDean Andrew for organizing the event, to Kay for the lovely reception, to all members who attended, and to those who brought food for the reception. Special thanks go to St. Mary's for opening their Rodgers Trillium organ to chapter use. Good planning, Andrew – we did it all in 80 minutes!!

The Christmas Organ Music of Franklin Ashdown

On Tuesday, **December 9, 7 PM., James Welch** will present a recital of Advent- and Christmas-based organ music by the well-known composer **Franklin Ashdown**. The concert is part of the annual Christmas Creche Exhibit at the LDS Church in Palo Alto, now in its 21st year. The church, located at **3865 Middlefield Rd., Palo Alto**, houses a 2-manual 1981 Schoenstein For more complete information on the exhibit, see http://christmascreche.org/. Frank Ashdown, a retired physician, lives in Alamogordo, New Mexico. To date he has published 87 compositions

for organ, and 34 choral pieces. His works have been published by most of the major publishing houses of organ music, including H. W. Gray/ Warner Bros., MorningStar, Concordia, Augsburg-Fortress, Wayne Leupold Editions, H. T. FitzSimons, Fred Bock, Harold Flammer, Selah, and Seesaw Press.

He has been honored with the AGO Region II Composition Prize in 1989 for "Concerto for Organ and Strings," several annual ASCAP Standard Panel and ASCAPlus Awards, and listing in "International Who's Who in Music."

Among the works to be performed are his "Carol Fantasy," "Trompette de Noel," "Sussex Variations," "Tryptich on an English Noel," and "Chorale Variants on Two Noels." Also will be selections from his newest collection, "Noel!" This collection, published this year by Augsburg, contains some of his most inventive and exciting work to date, including a "Bethlehem Sicilienne" on "Wie schön leuchtet," "Fantasia Navidena Antigua" on "Riu, Riu, Chiu," a carillon-sortie on "The First Noel," variations on "Joys Seven," and a delightful pastorale on the theme from Saint-Saëns' Christmas oratorio. The composer will be in town for this recital and will also play one of his own compositions. Come meet Dr. Ashdown and enjoy the amazing Christmas Creche display. All events are free.

An Incredible Experience

Let me tell you about an incredible experience – incredible, because it happened to me! But, then, it could happen to anyone.

Today. October 19, 2008. After playing for church this morning, playing French music in the member recital this afternoon, doing AGO North Coast District Convener work in the evening, and then writing an email to an organist in France, I felt inspired to write to you.

Why? Because, on a Saturday afternoon on a recent trip to Paris, France, I happened to walk into St. Francois Xavier Cathedral and was standing in the center aisle. One priest was at the altar. A young man was walking down a side aisle. For some reason, a little voice inside me said "he's the organist". Well, I heard myself say across the sanctuary, "are you the organist?" "Yes", he said. Fortunately, he spoke perfect English. After introductions, he offered me organ time following the Sunday 11:00 a.m. mass. Wow! How lucky is that?

The next day, Bob and I arrived so early, we were able to worship for half of the preceding mass.

Before the 11:00 a.m. mass began, another voice said to me.... "go find the door to the organ loft so you'll know where to meet the organist following the service". So, I went and found the door. The organist was standing there and said "there you are, I've been waiting for you. I've got to begin the service, come on up and join me in the loft". I quickly went and got my husband, and we both joined the organist in the loft for the entire service!

Now. That's a WOW! Was I inspired? You betcha. Was I impressed? Absolutely. Did I enjoy the music? No question about that. But, most importantly, was I able to worship God (even though the mass was in French and I speak absolutely no French), feel His presence, be thankful? Yes, indeed!!!
