LESSONS FROM THE GEESE

Milton Olson

1. – As each goose flaps its wings, it creates an "uplift" for the bird following. By flying in a "V" formation, the whole flock adds 71% more flying range than if each bird flew alone.

<u>Lesson:</u> People who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going quicker and easier because they are traveling on the thrust of one another.

2. – When a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to fly alone and quickly gets back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the birds immediately in front.

<u>Lesson:</u> If we have as much sense as a goose, we will join in formations with those who are headed where we want to go.

3. – When the lead goose gets tired, it rotates back into the formation and another goose flies at the point position.

<u>Lesson:</u> It pays to take turns doing the hard tasks and sharing leadership – with people, as with geese – interdependent with one another.

4. – The geese in formation honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed.

<u>Lesson:</u> We need to make sure our honking from behind is encouraging – not something less than helpful.

5. – When a goose gets sick or wounded or shot down, two geese drop out of formation and follow their fellow member down to help provide protection. They stay with this member of the flock until he or she is able to fly again or dies. Then they launch out on their own, with another formation or to catch up with their own flock.

<u>Lesson:</u> If we have as much sense as the geese, we'll stand by one another like they do.

On Saturday March 14th, the Chapter hosted a 3 hour **Pedals Pizza and Pipes** program at **Sunnyvale Presbyterian Church**. Twelve students attended, with 11 taking advantage of the opportunity to play on a 'real' pipe organ. The organ is a Balcom and Vaughan organ built in Seattle in 1986 with 38 voices and 54 ranks. Participant ages ranged from 8 to 17, and playing levels from 2 to 8. **Libby Codd** served as the registrar. Assisting with information presentations and demonstrations were host organist **Valerie Sterk**, Chair **Patricia Milstead, Elisabeth Pintar**, **Melody Bast, Libby Codd**, **John Chang**, and **Diane Keller**. All presenters answered some interesting questions of the students. **Melanie Cervi** and **John Chang** brought pipes, courtesy of member **Roger Inkpen**, for the students' hands-on experience. Each student was given a packet which included a paper model organ to be assembled, a copy of Sandra Soderland's "A Young Person's Guide to the Pipe Organ", a San Jose AGO chapter teacher list, and **Lothar Bandermann's** publication entitled "About the Pipe Organ," and copies of his newest CD entitled "Folk Music for the Organ". Newsletter Editor **Kenneth Talbot** took a picture of each performer. **Valerie Sterk** organized and led the pizza party at the conclusion of the demonstration. The students, families, and attending organists enjoyed fellowship and further pipe organ chat over lunch.
