Johannes Brahms and Clara Schumann

The modern biographers worry "how far it went," their tender friendship. They wonder just what it means when he writes he thinks of her constantly, his guardian angel, beloved friend. The modern biographers ask the rude, irrelevant question of our age, as if the event of two bodies meshing together establishes the degree of love, forgetting how softly Eros walked in the nineteenth century, how a hand held overlong or a gaze anchored in someone's eyes could unseat a heart, and nuances of address not known in our egalitarian language could make the redolent air tremble and shimmer with the heat of possibility. Each time I hear the Intermezzi, sad and lavish in their tenderness, I imagine the two of them sitting in a garden among late-blooming roses and dark cascades of leaves, letting the landscape speak for them, leaving us nothing to overhear.

Leipzig Bachfest 2010 Dian Ruder

Europe has many summer music festivals, but my husband and I enjoy the Bachfest in Leipzig for its plethora of concerts, superb quality of performers, historical context and organ emphasis. Up to five concerts a day crowd its schedule, some free, some expensive, some not. We chose what we wanted six months in advance and only one was no longer available.

J.S. Bach directed music for several of the city's churches, notably St. Nicholas and St. Thomas, where his statue dominates the plaza and he is interred in front of the alter. Our first organ concert was at St. Thomas, a reproduction of the concert Mendelssohn performed in 1840 to reintroduce the music of J.S. Bach to the people of Leipzig. What a fun program, with Mendelssohn's Sonate #3, then Bach's Fugue in E Flat major, "Smucke Dich," Prelude and Fugue in A minor, Passacaglia in C minor, Pastoral in F, Toccata and Fugue in D minor (!) ending with a fantasy improvisation of Mendelssohn's own. This concert ended with the current organist's own fantasy improvisation.

Fabulous! "Organ trips" to outlying cities gave us a ride through the countryside, a tour of a castle or church, a concert on a Bach-related organ with a short lecture translated into English, and the camaraderie of like-minded folks. These highly ornate Baroque organs are stunning.

We delighted each morning in a free musical church service, such as the Leipzig Choir and Orchestra at St. Michael's performing Scarlotti's "Stabat Mater," a tour de force of polyphonic bravery at break-neck speed. Other days we heard an excellent youth choir, a small ensemble of four women, a great church choir and orchestra, and others.

The theme this year was "Bach to Mendelssohn," but modern music was not excluded. The world-renowned Leipzig Gewandhaus Orchestra performed an integrated, varied program starting with the Gewandhaus organist playing Bach's variations on Von Himmel Hoch. Next the orchestra and choir gave Stravinsky's choral variations on Bach's music, and thirdly a chorale variation on the same theme by Laurent Mettraux, b. 1970. I had to admit, Bach's the best!

The Sunday morning service at St. Thomas placed Bach's Cantata BWV 135, "Ach Herr, mich armen Sunder," performed by the boys choir and Gewandhaus orchestra, within the service in the style of Bach's time. What a sense of history, with the choir founded in 1212 and formerly directed by J.S. Bach. The place was packed 30 minutes early.



We heard the most exquisite music at the final concert, Bach's Mass in B minor performed with passion and precision by the English Monteverdi Choir and Baroque Soloists, directed by Sir John Elliot Gardiner. I never saw a standing ovation at the Bachfest until this concert, and this ovation lasted over ten minutes!

I could say more about the Bach Museum, the Mendelssohn House, and street musicians, but obviously I recommend this event highly!

Jin-Kyung Lim

Jin-Kyung Lim, an organist and harpsichordist, was born in Seoul, Korea. She earned a BA in organ performance and another BA in piano performance in Yonsei University, Korea, then received an MM in organ performance and a DMA in performance and literature at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (UIUC). At UIUC, she studied the harpsichord with Charlotte Mattax Moersch and the organ with Dana Robinson. She is a recipient of several fellowships including Marcella Brownson Fellowship and University fellowships. She played the organ during the Watu Gregorian Festival in Belgium and a concert in Paris in 1993 as a member of Seoul Women Gregorian Chant Choir. As an active chamber musician, she enjoyed playing with various ensemble groups, including UI Symphony (for the performance of Saint-Saens's Organ Symphony in 2004), UI Chamber Singers, UI Wind Orchestra, Champaign-Urbana Symphony Orchestra, Baroque Artist of Champaign-Urbana, and Women's Glee Club. She played the organ for Marie Clair Alain's master class in Montreal, 2007 and for the Friday Noon Organ Recital Series at Church of Christ Cathedral, Indianapolis, 2008, and had several harpsichord and organ solo recitals at UIUC. As a church musician, she has served for several churches in Korea as well as in the States, such as St. Paul Catholic Church in Danville, IL as music director, and St. John Catholic Church in Champaign, IL, and St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church in Charleston, IL as organist.

Her performing repertory includes all periods – especially favored are pre-Baroque composers' and J.S Bach's organ works as well as late French Romantic composers' works. J.S Bach's and Maurice Durufle deeply inspire her. As an amateur singer, she likes to sing Robert Schumann's art songs, and songs from cantatas, oratorios, and masses. She is enthusiastic about exploring wonderful instruments and visiting different churches for both attending liturgies and finding the trend of church music. She is interested in arranging choral works for the organ and other instruments.

She moved to the San Jose area in June, 2010 after her husband was offered a position at a semiconductor company Tessera. It is great pleasure for her to have time on the beach with her 5- and 8-year-old sons, and to travel with family for hikes and campout. She is also very much interested in cooking; she enjoys collecting recipes and tasting different cultural heritage from various countries. She deeply appreciates the hospitality of the members of the San Jose chapter, AGO, and hopes to be an active member of this wonderful community.
