On Sunday afternoon, **15 May** at 3pm, we were treated to a recital featuring Bach, Buxtehude, and more. Andrew also included three choral works with the help of a small choir of guild members and the congregation. Many thanks to Andrew and best wishes for his continuing studies!

As Andrew is a choral director as well as an organist, his concert included a small choir of guild members and the congregation singing three Hymns. Andrew introduced each by playing a prelude arrangement of the hymn. The three hymns were "*O Blessed* 

### Spring", "Draw Us in the Spirit's Tether," and "Celebrate the Gift of Music."

He played pieces from Buxtehude, Bach, Mendelssohn, and Below.

Andrew Birling is currently serving as Music Director at St Luke's Episcopal Church in Minneapolis. MN. He is responsible for service playing as well as directing the choir, the hand bell choir, and the recorder consort. Prior to his relocation to Minneapolis, he served for five years at Campbell United Methodists in Campbell, CA where he worked with Mary Ann Gee.

## ABOUT THE PLEASURE OF HEARING MUSIC (Condensation of "Your Brain on Music" in the May issue of *Discover* magazine)

#### from Lothar Bandermann

Using a PET scanner, which detects the release of the feelgood neurotransmitter *dopamine*, as well as fMRI, which detects brain activity, researchers found that listening to music you like seems to have the same effect as tasty food and sex: <u>Before</u> feeling enjoyable chills in response to the music, there is a dopamine rush in the region of the brain associated with anticipating rewards, followed by a second dopamine rush in the brain's pleasure center. We seem to crave to hear the next note, harmony or phrase, and the cycle of craving and fulfillment seems to be what makes us wanting to hear more.

Why does some music please so much while others leave us unmoved? Researchers compressed musical selections in a "lossless" fashion i.e. which exploits repetition and redundancy without losing "content." (Exactly what was left out in that compression was not specified in the article but would have been insightful.) Great works could be compressed to less than 1/2 but less memorable music to only 2/3. There is, of course, much more to the difference between great music and "schlock", and, I am sure, each one of us could come up with a long list of items.

The Frasier Organ Scholarship auditions were held at Los Gatos Presbyterian Church on Saturday morning, May 7. We are pleased to announce that **Elisabeth Pintar** is the winner of our Frasier scholarship for 2011. Our chapter will present her with the \$1000 award at our Annual Membership Meeting/Officer Installation/Potluck Dinner to be held 4:00pm on Sunday, June 5, at Pat Milstead's home in San Jose. Congratulations, Elisabeth!

Elisabeth received a BA in Music from Brigham Young University, and is currently studying organ with James Welch. She has been serving as organist at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Santa Clara since December 2000. Elisabeth also subs at St. Luke's Anglican Church in Los Alto Hills and is the choir director at the Hillsdale LDS Ward. Before moving to the Bay Area, she held organ positions in various churches in Idaho, New Jersey, and Utah. For her Frasier audition, Elisabeth performed J.S. Bach's "Dorian (Doric) Toccata in D Minor," Vaughan Williams' "Rhosymedre," Reger's "Introduction and Passacaglia in D Minor," and the hymn "Holy, Holy, Holy" (Nicaea). She plans to use the Frasier scholarship award to continue private organ lessons, work toward AGO certification, and pass the lengthy audition to play at the Salt Lake City Tabernacle, a dream she has held for many years.
