## Last Year's Frasier Scholarship Winner Recital – Elisabeth Pintar

One **10 June 2012** at the **Los Gatos Methodist Church**, 111 Church Street, Los Gatos **Elisabeth Pintar** gave an excellent recital. She based her selection around the theme of the "Hunter" and the "The Squirrel".

The first piece represents the Hunter "packing his bags" but as perhaps you do yourself, he keeps forgetting on more thing to pack and keeps marching back into the house (Ronde Francaise, Leon Boëllmann). The second piece self-explanaory, do you see a sunrise braking through the fog on the outskirts of a forest (Prelude on Morning Has Broken", David Lasky)? The third piece is the call of "the Hunt" (Hunting Horn Scherzo, Alexander Schreiner). The fourth piece is the squirrel minding his own business whet he realizes someone is NOT after the acorns in his mouth but after HIM ("The Squirrel", Powell). The fifth, whew, the Squirrel got away and is dancing a "gig" for another day (Fugue in G-Major (a la Gigue), BWV 577, J.S. Bach)!

The sixth, the Hunter is frustrated much like that famous coyote but towards the middle of the piece his conscience gets the better of him ... killing poor little squirrels, the grief takes over for what could have done. He

### **OPEN POSITIONS**

**Los Altos Lutheran Church** is seeking an **Organist** and/or **Choir Director**. Ours is a warm and welcoming congregation with a liturgical service of mixed musical styles, with an attractive facility and location. Time commitment: is approximately 10 hours per week; possibility of flexible schedule with use of MIDI.

**Services:** one weekly Sunday service, as well as events throughout year. Adult choir, SATB, rehearses weekly and sings two times a month (Sep through early June). Soloists, instrumentalists, and small ensembles are often scheduled on the choir's "off" Sundays and during the summer.

We have a three-manual, 1997 Allen Digital Organ with high quality, digitally sampled sounds and a "smart recorder" MIDI; 1911 Chickering grand piano.

**Duties:** support and enhance worship of the congregation with quality organ/piano music and accompaniment; for the combined position, direct adult choir, soloists, and small vocal ensembles; support various music performances R=The choir director collaborates with the pastor and the music committee to select repertoire; give direction to the overall music program of the congregation.

**Qualifications:** accomplished organist and pianist; for the combined position, also experience in directing choirs, worship service coordination, and selecting appropriate music according to the lectionary and season.

**Salary Range for the combined position:** \$14,000 - \$20,000 based on experience and qualifications.

### RATIONALE FOR DISCONTINUING GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES

Dear Region IX Deans and District Conveners:

As most of you know from various emails, the information on the AGO national website, and the information presented at the 2012 AGO National Convention, one of the changes that has been approved by National Council is the elimination of the Grievance Procedures. Effective immediately, no more grievances will be accepted. This is the information which appears on the AGO website (http://www.agohq.org/national/reorganize.html) regarding this:

After considering responses from the Long Range Planning Survey as well as input from members at the chapter, regional and national level who have been involved in the grievance process, the AGO National Council voted to discontinue the use of the Grievance Procedures. This process also involved input from grievants, grievance committee members, professional development coordinators, regional officers, or observers of the process. Their overwhelming reaction was that the Grievance Procedures did not accomplish what was hoped (on the part of the grievant), took a lot of time (on the part of the committee) and left people with a negative view of the Guild (on the part of the church). Collegial relationships among Guild members have been damaged, and potential members of AGO have chosen not to join after hearing about grievances in their communities.

The AGO would like to replace the procedure with a system that will provide support for its members in their employment as organists, choir directors, church or synagogue musicians or in other professional roles. During the 2012–2013 term, the Committee on Career Development and Support will work to phase out the use of the Grievance Procedures and replace them with more positive options for our members. Words and phrases which appeared in the survey and other responses include: conflict management, relationship building, mentoring, counseling, training, assistance in finding another job. referrals for legal counsel and assistance, advocacy. These suggestions will guide the committee as it strives to provide alternate opportunities for AGO members who look for support and advice when dealing with employment difficulties.
