*O*n a sadder note, I hope everyone will take a moment this April 1st to remember and celebrate one of the finest (and most overlooked) composer's we know. He continues to bring much to the classical world and no concert hall is left frowning when his works are preformed! I am including part of his biography for your reference so as not to confuse him with my husband, Jason, as they both share the same birthDAY, not the year!

P.D.Q. Bach was born on April 1, 1742 and died on May 5, 1807, the dates on his first tombstone (before he was moved to an unmarked pauper's grave) were inscribed "1807-1742" in a transparent attempt to make it appear that he could not have been the son of J.S., who died in 1750. Nice try, Bach family — close, but no cigar: some of us, or at least one of us, are not fooled, or at least, is not fooled.

"P.D.Q. Bach once said that his illustrious father gave him no training in music whatsoever, and it is one of the few things he said that we can believe without reservation. It has been said that the only original places in his music are those places where he forgot what he was stealing. And, since his memory was even shorter than his sightedness, he was in point of fact one of the most original composers ever to stumble along the musical pike. P.D.Q. Bach was perhaps not as pitiful as we are often led to believe: he was, by all accounts, intimately acquainted with all three components of the proverbial wine/women/song life style, He died a wealthy man (due to a little patent medicine thing he had going on the side), and he can now boast 17 record albums and annual concerts in New York City devoted almost exclusively to his own music. How many of us can say that? Well, can you?"—biographical notes provided by Prof. Schickele.

CONCERT OF A NEW ST. MARK'S ORGAN

On Saturday, March 29, at 7 p.m., James Welch, organist of St. Mark's Episcopal Church, Palo Alto, will present an inaugural recital on the newly acquired Schoenstein pipe organ which has been installed in the small chapel on the campus of St. Mark's Episcopal, 600 Colorado Ave., Palo Alto.

The organ was custom built in 1984 for the residence of Dr. and Mrs. Robert Malone of Santa Paula (Ventura County), California. When the Malones relocated to Healdsburg in the 1990's, they brought the organ with them to their new home. Mrs. Malone has been an active member of the Redwood Empire Chapter of the AGO.

The original chapel at St. Mark's was built in 1948. Until now it has had a series of electronic organs. A memorial gift of a St. Mark's parishioner made possible the purchase of the Malone organ, which was just installed at St. Mark's in February 2014. (The main sanctuary of St. Mark's, was built in 1958 and houses a 4-manual Casavant organ.)
