Ugo Sforza in Recital Oct. 14



Ugo Sforza presented a great organ recital on Friday evening, October 14, at the Sunnyvale Presbyterian Church. This is the third year that Mr. Sforza has presented a wonderful recital for us. Ugo has earned degrees in organ performance, composition, piano, and cultural heritage (historic keyboard instruments) in Italy and Austria. He has performed organ recitals for concert series and organ festivals in Europe and the U.S.A.

Ugo's program included a broad variety of exciting organ repertoire. He opened his recital with Reger's monumental *Phantasie und Fuge über B.-A.-C.-H.*, op. 46. Throughout the dense, virtuosic fantasy and the extended double fugue, Ugo showcased the variety of tonal colors in the

57-rank Balcom and Vaughan instrument. His colorful, contrasting, and masterful registrations engaged his listeners in Reger's complex settings of the Bb-A -C-B motif, and created a dramatic performance of this impressive work.

Next, Mr. Sforza and Valerie Sterk (piano) presented César Franck's exquisitely beautiful *Prelude, Fugue et Variation en Si mineur, op. 18*, the version for organ (*harmonium*) and piano. And yes, Ugo made the organ sound like a harmonium. The piece started with a gentle *Andantino* B-minor melody on the organ, accompanied by gentle triplets in the piano, leading to the key of F-sharp minor.

A subsequent solo soliloquy in the piano began strong and then ended in pianissimo, ushering in a quiet fugue in B minor, led by the organ. This fugue built to a fortissimo that segued immediately into a restatement of the *Andantino* melody from the beginning, this time with the piano accompaniment in 16th notes, returning the piece to its initially gentle mood. This work was excellently performed.

Ugo closed his program with three of his original compositions: *Organum Vox Dei, op. 3* (2003), *Sunshine, op. 9* (2012), and a first performance of a new composition, *Triumphal March, op. 18*(2016).

"Theme and Variations in honour of Saint Walburga," the first of three pieces in Organum Vox Dei, op. 3, was inspired by the saint's life. As a servant of God, Walburga spent her life caring for the poor. Ugo featured expressive dynamics and colors of the organ throughout this piece. The second piece in his op. 3, "Meditation for the Good Friday," arose from the composer's deep reflection upon the meaning of the Passion and Death of the Lord Jesus Christ. The final piece in Organum Vox Dei, "Regina Caeli," is a tribute to the Virgin Mary.

Ugo's next composition was "Sunshine," composed in 2012 after completing his postgraduate organ studies in Edinburgh, Scotland. In this piece, he aimed to depict the picturesque landscapes of Scotland, long a source of inspiration for composers.

The last of Mr. Sforza's compositions was "*Triumphal March*," which combined elements of traditional organ repertoire with influences from 20th-century film music.

Recital Survey Results

For Ugo Sforza's recital we asked each who attended to fill out a survey form. We asked them to indicate how many AGO recital they have attended, did they like the music, how did they find out about the recital, etc.

More than 80 people came to hear the Ugo Sforza's recital and 34 of them completed the recital evaluation form. On the evaluation form we ask whether this is the first time they have been to an AGO recital and if not, how many recitals they have attended in the past. On this occasion, 8 (24%) respondents indicated this was their first AGO recital. Those who have attended 1 to 3 AGO recitals in the past was 16 (47%), 7 (21%) attended 4 to 9 recitals, and 3 (9%) have attended 10 or greater in the past. We also ask them to tell us how they learned about the recital. Most of the responses learned about the recital from a church member or the church's bulletin. The next highest category was email or a friend. Three respondents attended because they received an Email and thirteen from a friend. Seven respondents wished to be placed on an email notification list. A total of 100% of the people surveyed rated the recital overall as either "superb" or "excellent."

We also asked each respondent for comments. Here are three of 13 comments:

"Nice variety to program. Piano – organ combo especially nice"

"I have attended concerts in which Valerie Sterk plays! Thanks to Valerie for organizing this evening concert!"

"I really loved to see young children at a concert. Perhaps some shorter pieces that would appeal to them."

LOTHAR BANDERMANN MUSIC

Lothar Bandermann's website contains all recorded works of his; including all pieces for organ or piano, and the latter have also PDF files of the scores **except those currently in publication** (like the recent "Litanies for Organ"). So if you find any interesting enough, copy the PDF files before they are published! Published music is getting more and more expensive.

Lothar has compiled 40 toccatas on 2 disks (one for old masters, one for contemporary composers). The main purpose was to put together a number of

toccatas, some of which are famous (and difficult), others also great (but easier). Most of them he recorded on the organ at his church, St. Joseph of Cupertino, and half-a-dozen downloaded from the internet (too difficult for Lothar and played by great organists on fabulous organs here and in Europe). Your students or even yourselves may be interested in having this collection (which also contains Toccatas Lothar has written, of course).
