John Walker Concert and Workshop

Internationally known organist John Walker, Former Chapter Dean (1974-1975) and Former National President (2014-2015) will present a Concert on Friday 23 March 2018, at the Campbell United Methodist Church, 1675 Winchester Blvd, Campbell, CA at 7:30 PM. Walker is currently professor of organ performance at



Baltimore's renowned Peabody Institute, and former president of the American Guild of Organists. Walker's repertoire ranges from baroque to modern. The cost of the concert is \$20 https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/John Walker (organist)

He will also present a Workshop on **Creative Hymn Playing**. The workshop will be on **Saturday 24 March** 2018 at the **First United Methodist Church**, 625 Hamilton Avenue, Palo Alto, **4:30-6:30 PM**. The cost of the work shop is \$10.

John Walker is Minister of Music Emeritus at Brown Memorial Park Avenue Presbyterian Church in Baltimore and a member of the organ faculty at Peabody Conservatory of Music, following earlier positions at Shadyside Presbyterian Church and Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, The Riverside Church and Manhattan School of Music in New York City, First Methodist Church in Palo Alto and at San Jose State University. He has recently served as Artist-in-Residence at Church of the Redeemer and as interim Director of Music/Organist at Emmanuel Episcopal Church, Baltimore.

John Walker has performed in recital and as concerto soloist throughout North America, Europe, and in Asia. Continued Page 2

San Jose, Calif. Feb. 23 five students treated 75 members and guests to an evening of organ selections, including works of Bach, Franck, Reger, Buxtehude, Mendelssohn-Bartholdy, Casanoves and an original piece by Curtis Hawthorne, student and composer. Sunnyvale Presbyterian Church hosted the annual chapter student recital on their 1986 Balcom and Vaughan instrument of 57 ranks, 38 voices, and 3,113 pipes.

Kirin Eom, a student of **Dian Ruder**, opened the program with Franck's *Prélude*, *Fugue et Variation*, *Op.18*.

Sam William, student of **Valerie Sterk**—Organist at Sunnyvale Presbyterian, performed chorales of Max Reger and the *B-flat Major*, *Prelude and Fugue*, of Bach.

Ruth Kamas added the Bach *G-Minor Prelude and Fugue BWV 558*. Ruth studies organ and theory with **Margaret Kvamme**.

Eleanor Muhawi, who has studied with Arleen Pickett and Dr. James Welch, and who was the 2017 Frasier scholarship winner, performed Herzlich tut mich verlangen by Bach, Prelude, Fugue, and Chaconne by Buxtehude, and a beautiful rendition of Felix Mendelssohn-Bartholdy's Sonata in A, Opus 65, #3, Andante tranquillo. A student of Valerie Sterk and Angela Kraft-Cross, Curtis "Fjord" Hawthorne concluded the program with Sonata de corneta i clarins by Narcis Casanoves, and his own original composition based on Psalm 91.

A reception honoring students and teachers was held immediately following. We also thank Valerie Sterk the organist at Sunnyvale Presbyterian Church and the Church Officials for their sponsorship of this event. **Darryl Parker** \$\mathcal{J}\$

Continued from Page 1: He has appeared frequently with the San Francisco Symphony under the baton of Michael Tilson Thomas; with the National Symphony Orchestra of Taiwan, Jahja Ling, conductor; and at conventions of the American Guild of Organists, the American Choral Directors Association, and the Korean Association of Organists. On the eve of the millennium, John Walker appeared on nationwide television in Taiwan during a four-hour marathon concert at the National Concert Hall in Taipei. Pipedreams, the nationally syndicated program of Minnesota Public Radio, has often featured his performances. In October 2006 Pipedreams devoted its entire program to his performances, under the title "Walker on the Wild Side."

John Walker earned the Doctor of Musical Arts degree at Stanford University, where he was Assistant University Organist. He holds two Master of Music degrees *cum laude* from American Conservatory of Music in Chicago, where he later served as a member of the faculty. Dr. Walker was the 1984 alumni recipient of the Professional Achievement Award from Westminster College. In 1999 he was awarded a Fulbright Fellowship to teach and to perform in Taiwan.

A Fellow of the American Guild of Organists, John Walker is Immediate Past President of the AGO, having previously served as Vice President, Treasurer, and as Coordinator of two regional conventions. He has been performer and clinician at the Montreat, Mo-Ranch, Lake Junaluska, Westminster College, and Richner-Strong church music conferences. Heralded for his dynamic hymn playing, recently in Taiwan he was organist and conductor for two CD recordings of hymns sung in Mandarin and in Taiwanese. In 2015 he was Visiting Professor at the Shanghai Conservatory of Music, and in 2017 he adjudicated international competitions in organ performance in both Taipei and Shanghai, marking his 17th professional visit to Asia.

Directions: From I-80: At Vallejo, take I-780 east towards Benicia. After East Fifth St exit, get into right lane and exit onto I-680 North (Exit 7A). From I-680: At Benicia, take the Lake Herman Road exit (Exit 61). Go east (toward the water) on Lake Herman Road and cross the railroad overpass. Take the first right onto Industrial Way and go 1.3 miles. The plant is on the right just past a curve – look for the 42' tall erecting room!

The PIPE ORGAN ENCOUNTER (POE) is an introduction to the pipe organ through instruction in organ playing, repertoire, history, design, and construction. These regional summer music camps for teenage students provide private and group instruction in service playing and solo repertoire, opportunities to learn about the musical heritage of various religious denominations, and a chance for young musicians to meet others with similar interests. Piano or organ proficiency ranging from intermediate to advanced is required. Scholarship assistance is available.

The POE+ is a summer program filled with practical information and instruction for adult keyboard musicians interested in improving their service-playing skills. Participants will be introduced to basic organ skills through private instruction and classes. The weeklong experience will lead to greater confidence and competence at the organ.


