Dr. James Welch Concert



On Friday, November 16, at 7:30 p.m., Dr. James Welch performed a recital of organ sonatas at the Mission Church on the campus of Santa Clara University, Santa Clara, California. The recital, sponsored by the San José Chapter of the AGO, was given in memory of the late Professor Herbert Nanney (1918-1996), Welch's organ professor at Stanford University and former dean of the San José Chapter. Representing the Nanney family at the recital was Herbert Nanney's son Duncan.

Welch's program consisted of four complete sonatas from different musical eras: from the baroque, Bach's Sonata No. 5 in C major; from the classic period, João de Sousa Carvalho's Sonata in D major; from the romantic period, Rheinberger's Sonata No. 4 in A minor; and from the 20th century, Hindemith's Sonata No. 1. The organ at the Mission Church is by Schantz, built in 1975. Dr. Welch Continued on Page 2.

Jim Welch's concert November 16 was more than a breath of fresh air at the Santa Clara Mission Church on the campus of Santa Clara University. Although the campus had been closed during the week because of smoke from the Camp Fire in Butte County, the small crowd was treated to a stunning program of sonatas from Bach, Hindemith, Carvalho and Rheinberger.

As usual Welch's accuracy and articulation brought clarity to the varied works presented. The entire event was dedicated to the memory of Herbert Nanny, Dr. Welch's mentor and professor at Stanford University. Herbert Nanny was born 100 years ago.

The first work, J.S. Bach's Sonata in C Major (BWV 529), delighted the audience with all three voices with a voice for each hand on the manuals and the basso continuo for pedals.

Shifting gears and centuries, Dr. Welch played Paul Hindemith's Sonata No. 1, which illustrated many rhythmic and thematic ideas of a neo-baroque composition written in 1937. Although not an organist, Hindemith provided the performer of the work the latitude to explore all the dynamic and coloristic possibilities of the organ.

The third sonata was written by Joan de Sousa Carvalho, a Portuguese composer, who had an organ with manuals only, no pedals. Dr. Welch demonstrated just how brilliant Carvalho's work is by using many different techniques of alternating manuals and voices in different registers.

The final sonata was Joseph Rheinberger's No. 4 in A Minor, the last movement or which is a Chromatic Fugue, simple in a descending theme but intricate in restating the themes of the previous two movements.

Those who braved the air quality were rewarded to a world-class performance. \square



Passing of William Ferguson



It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of **William Ferguson**, who died on Monday September 3, 2018 as the result of a fall. {This information was supplied by his sister Marge Ferguson

A. William Ferguson studied Organ and Music Education in the 1960s at American University in Washington D.C. and Western Connecticut State College. Among his teachers were Frederick Swann, Richard Dirksen, and John Wright Harvey. From 1967-1984, he served as Organist and Choirmaster at the 1st Congregational Church in New Milford, CT where he maintained ties for many, many years. He also founded and directed the New Milford Oratorio Choir. With that choir, he directed the world premier of Eric Simon's Te Deum in memory of Martin Luther King.

Following a move to California, Bill worked as organist and sometimes choirmaster for a number of Bay Area protestant churches including Hillcrest Congregational Church in Pleasant Hill, All Saints Episcopal Church in San Leandro, and Hillsdale United Methodist Church in San Mateo. Bill's final long-term position was as the organist/pianist at the 1st Congregational Church of San Jose from 2001-2016.

Bill was a skilled and sensitive organist who clearly loved the instrument. He was exacting in his expectations and generous with his talents. Bill was always eager to learn new styles and to stretch his skills, and was very supportive of musicians and ministers who shared his passion for music's role in the church.

In addition to his music, Bill also worked as a bookkeeper with several small Bay Area startups and taught classes in safe driving for senior citizens.
