Here's an excellent New Year's resolution for you: encourage an eligible organ student to apply for the 2019 Frasier Organ Scholarship. As a reminder, the scholarship is open to current members of our San Jose chapter, and to organ students studying with or sponsored by current members (previous winners are not eligible). The scholarship amount is \$1000.



THE ARP SCHNITGER ORGAN IN THE ST. JAOCBI CATHEDRAL IN HAMBURG GERMANY



Between 1689 and 1693 Arp Schniter built a four manual organ. He used 25 ranks of pipes from an older organ built by Gottfried Fritsche. Albert Schweitzer indicated that this organ is one of the most valuable organs in the world. "It was built by one of the greatest master

builders of the past, in the present time it is an irreplaceable monument to the consummate sound character of the instruments of the classical era of organ music." In September 1720 Bach auditioned for the St. Jacobi post.


However, Jochim Heitmann, who paid 4000 coffers, won the position.


In 1942 the windchests, pipework, and ornaments of the church were removed for safe keeping. In 1944 the church was destroyed and nothing of the tracker action mechanism, bellows, or case survived. The church was rebuilt and by 1961 the organ was reinstalled. One can how hear the sound of the organ was it was in the 1700.

John Wesley's Directions for Singing

- **I.** Learn these tunes before you learn any others; afterwards learn as many as you please.
- II. Sing them exactly as they are printed here, without altering or mending them at all; and if you have learned to sing them otherwise, unlearn it as soon as you can.
- III. Sing all. See that you join with the congregation as frequently as you can. Let not a single degree of weakness or weariness hinder you. If it is a cross to you, take it up, and you will find it a blessing.
- **IV.** Sing lustily and with good courage. Beware of singing as if you were half dead, or half asleep; but lift up your voice with strength. Be no more afraid of your voice now, nor more ashamed of its being heard, then when you sung the songs of Satan.
- V. Sing modestly. Do not bawl, so as to be heard above or distinct from the rest of the congregation, that you may not destroy the harmony; but strive to unite your voices together, so as to make one clear melodious sound.
- VI. Sing in time. Whatever time is sung be sure to keep with it. Do not run before nor stay behind it; but attend close to the leading voices, and move therewith as exactly as you can; and take care not to sing to slow. This drawling way naturally steals on all who are lazy; and it is high time to drive it out from us, and sing all our tunes just as quick as we did at first.
- VII. Above all sing spiritually. Have an eye to God in every word you sing. Aim at pleasing him more than yourself, or any other creature. In order to do this attend strictly to the sense of what you sing, and see that your heart is not carried away with the sound, but offered to God continually; so shall your singing be such as the Lord will approve here, and reward you when he cometh in the clouds of heaven.

Reasons We Sing Hymns

The Lord said, "My soul delighteth in the song of the heart; yea, the song of the righteous is a prayer unto me, and it shall be answered with a blessing upon their heads"

Inspirational music is an essential part of church meetings. The hymns invite the Spirit of the Lord, create a feeling of reverence, unify us as members, and provide a way for us to offer praises to the Lord.

Some of the greatest sermons are preached by the singing of hymns. Hymns move us to repentance and good works, build testimony and faith, comfort the weary, console the mourning, and inspire us to endure to the end."

Hymns teach theology.

Hymns allow for a more authentic response of emotional expression.

Hymns unite generations of Christian people.

Hymns are a valuable aid to worship because they help to focus our attention on the goodness and glory of the Lord. The hymn "How Great Thou Art," for example, reminds us of God's majesty revealed in creation, His perfect sacrifice on the cross, and His coming return for His own—all matters of praise.

Remember: "If in faith and selflessness we are giving all of our talents to the Lord to use as he wishes, then what He wants to happen, will happen."
