26 JANUARY CHAPTER EVENT PEDALS, PIPES, AND PIZZA

Our annual PPP was held on 26 January 2018 at Immanuel Lutheran Church, 14103 Saratoga Ave, Saratoga. This event is sponsored by our chapter members to give more exposure to the instrument that we love. Nine students participated this year. We wish to thank Elisabeth Pinter for organizing and conducting the event. Helping was Diane Ruder, Susan Snook-Luther, Colin Whitby-Strevens, Doris Reed, Margaret Kvamme, Darryl Parker, and Kenneth Talbot. Thank you all who helped.

Before the event the Susan and Margaret played various organ pieces so that the students could hear and appreciate the majesty of the organ.

First the various parts of the organ (couplers, pistons, tabs, etc.). Then the differences the between the organ and piano (pedals, legato touch, finger substitution, etc) were explained. Then Darryl Parker the various stops and sounds of the organ were explained and demonstrated. The mutation and mixtures stops were also explained along with the Swell and Crescendo pedals.

The students were then divided into two groups. While the first group played the organ the second group would visit the organ chamber and were also shown different types of organ pipes. We also explained how organ pipes made their sound. After a set amount of the time, the groups exchanged places.

In the first group each student played his/her piano piece on the organ. One of the Chapter members helped the students set the registration on the organ for the piece they were going to play.

Continued from page 1 A number of the pieces were even played several times with different registrations so that the student could hear how different registrations can affect the presentation of the piece.

The second group went into the organ chamber to see the various parts of the organ and some of the organ pipes. They also felt the sound vibrations of the big pedal pipes. Next a small number of pipes were demonstrated and explained how the pipes produce the sound and what the various parts are called.

Everyone had a good time and there was plenty of pizza afterward. We also thank Elisabeth Pinter the organist at Immanuel Lutheran Church and the Church Officials for their sponsorship of this event.


