Those who were not able to attend the **Orange County AGO Convention June 30 to July 3** missed a great time of concerts and fellowship! There were many highlights and personal favorites, starting with the opening worship service at **St. John's Lutheran Church** in Orange. The Cathedral Bells of the church presented two delightful pieces at a professional level, and the choir was stunning, 16 young, very well-trained voices. The 150 rank, 5 manual Ballantyne organ had a huge presence in that space, so the men of the choir sitting just below the horizontal trumpets were at some auditory risk.

Early every morning we started with a workshop, of which **Jim Welch** presented two. Bus rides to most venues let attendees network and chat, a well-utilized time. Our first trip was to the newly renovated **Christ Cathedral** (Catholic), formerly **Crystal Cathedral**. The Ruffatti organ restoration is not quite finished, but we heard a few pieces on part of it, via a replacement console. The main organ's 14 divisions are divided on all four sides of the cathedral. The Ruffatti console, pictured below, is super impressive, one of the largest ever built! Full concerts took place in the Arboretum with the Aeolian-Skinner organ. At lunch on the patio of the cathedral we were treated to a carillon concert.



The Ruffatti console, Christ Cathedral, formerly Crystal Cathedral One of the biggest "hits" was the concert with Cherry Rhodes, James Walker and Weiching Zhao, titled "Six Hands, Six Feet, One Bench." Transcriptions for three organists were mostly done by Weiching, and were very well-appropriated. No bench fights, no muddy overfill of sound, just clear and varied music. The ending worldpremier transcription of the Firebird Suite was awesome! Continued on page 2

Another highlight was the Catholic Mass at **San Juan Capistrano**, with the de Angelis Vocal Ensemble, filling the beautiful resonant space with gorgeous sound. We were hosted for several concerts and workshops at other churches with **Carole Terry** and **Jaebon Hwang**, among others. At Concordia University we heard the winner of the Quimby Young Organists competition, and a concert with organ and Concordia's full orchestra. All played superbly!

The final concert in Segerstrom Concert Hall, pictured below, was phenomenal, starting with awarding Frederick Swann the AGO's first-ever honorary FAGO Certificate. Then **Paul Jacobs** played for over an hour by memory! He was relaxed and confident, with short, friendly commentary, playing selections which were very enjoyable, including Charles Ives' Variations on America. It was July 3rd, after all. Taking the whole second half of the program was the Vierne Symphony No. 6, which Paul said was the first time he had played the symphony in totality before an audience. This most enjoyable concert topped off a great convention!

Douglas Franks



Douglas Franks, a longtime Bay Area church musician, was organist at Hope Lutheran, San Mateo for 16 years and member of the Palo Alto/Peninsula Chapter died of a brain tumor on 3 July 2019. He was 70.

He had a Master's Degree in Organ Performance and had performed in recital and as an accompanist throughout the

Bay Area over the years. He had worked with various choral organizations, most recently the Chorus of City College of San Francisco and Masterworks Chorale. He was currently on the faculties of the San Francisco Girls Chorus and the Young Women's Choral Projects of San Francisco. He was also accompanist and vocal coach at City College of San Francisco. He serves as seasonal accompanist for the Cantabile Youth Singers of Silicon Valley.

Douglas taught piano and organ privately and had been active in the American Guild of Organists. He most recently served as Chair of the Special Projects Committee of the San Francisco AGO Chapter. He was a prolific composer of organ hymn accompaniments. Many of his organ hymn settings and festive introductions to hymns have been published by Augsburg Fortress Press in a multi-volume organ accompaniment edition of the ELW hymnal.

New Hauptwerke Virtual Organ at St. Francis Episcopal in Willow Glen

St Francis Episcopal Church 1205 Pine Ave in San Jose is now home to a new virtual organ using Hauptwerk software. This instrument is being put together by **Michael Burroughs**, Director of Music and Spiritual Life at St Francis. The first sample sets include organs from several countries and periods:

- St Michael's Church, Zwolle, Netherlands (Schniter, 1721/Flentrop, 1955);
- St Martin's in Dudelange, Luxembourg (Stalhouth/Jann, 1912);
- St Lawrentius, Rotterdam (Marcussen & Son, 1973);
- St. Etienne, Caen (Cavaille-Coll, 1885);
- St Dominica, Reti, Italy (Dom Bedos organ by Fomentelli 2007).

The organ, like three of the original sources for each sample set, is 4 manuals and range from 56 ranks up to 98.

For a more hands-on experience of the organ the AGO will have a virtual organ crawl (no need to climb ladders since it's all in the hard drive) on **October 14** at **4 pm**. If you always wanted to play César Franck on a Cavaillé-Coll or Bach on a Schnitger.....without leaving San Jose....this is your big chance.

There will be three concerts as follows:

Nov. 3: 5 pm evensong followed by Jonathan Dimmock in concert.

Feb 2, 2020: 5 pm Evensong followed by Angela Craft Cross in concert.

May 3, 2020: 5 pm Evensong followed by Michael Burroughs in concert.

Michael has invited AGOSJ to attend an Organ Dedication and Evensong Concert at St. Francis Episcopal in Willow Glen, 1205 Pine Avenue, San Jose, at 5:00 PM on September 15.

In **October** Michael has graciously offered to give us a hands-on demonstration of the new organ, which is a Hauptwerke driven virtual organ, with digital sound samples from five impressive European instruments. (Details later.)

AGO Specifications

Ever wondered what the AGO specifications are? I play on two different organs, one at church and my own. I find that I make more mistakes in the pedal on the church organ than on mine own. So I took out the tape measure and to see if there were differences. The length of the playing surface of the sharps at the church are 5 inches and on my organ they are 5³/₄ inches. The key spacing on both pedal boards was the same, 21/2 inches(this is the AGO Spec) between the white keys, measured at the front end of the sharps. An internet search yielded the following document: 61/2 inches is the AGO spec for the sharps.
