Ugo Sforza Recital

Organ Recital at Sunnyvale Presbyterian Church Friday, 13th of September 2019, 7.30 pm

Ugo Sforza, an accomplished Italian organist and composer, will present an organ recital on **Friday evening, September 13, at 7:30pm in Sunnyvale Presbyterian Church** (728 W. Fremont Ave. Sunnyvale 94087). There is no admission charge; donations to Ugo will be received at the door. Mr. Sforza has presented wonderful recitals for us at Sunnyvale Presbyterian for the past five years, and we are eager to welcome him back to the Bay Area for another inspiring performance. Invite your friends and family to join us for this evening of beautiful organ music, and for a reception following. (Ugo and his wife Pamela welcomed twin daughters, Cristina and Gabriella, in April; we'll have photos of their lovely family at the reception.)

Mr. Sforza will open his program with J.S. Bach's masterful Passacaglia and Fugue in C Minor, BWV 582. Ugo will then introduce us to the music of Austrian organist and composer, J.F. Doppelbauer (1918-1989), performing his Partita Brevis (1987). Ugo's program includes several colorful pieces by Italian composers: "Six Verses in F Major" by Puccini, and "Country Scene" op. 132 no. 3 by M.E. Bossi (a contemporary of Puccini). Ugo will close his program with the majestic Chorale no. 1 in E Major by César Franck.

Ugo Sforza has earned degrees in organ performance, composition, piano, and cultural heritage (historic keyboard instruments) in Italy and Austria. He has performed organ recitals for concert series and organ festivals in Europe and the U.S.A. At Sunnyvale Presbyterian, Mr. Sforza will be performing on the 3-manual, 58-rank Balcom & Vaughan instrument built in 1986. See the San Jose AGO chapter website for the organ specifications: http://www.agosanjose.org/areaorgans/SunnyvalePresbyterian.pdf

Ugo will also be performing two organ recitals in San Francisco—at Grace Cathedral on Sunday, September 8 (4pm), and at St. Mary's Cathedral on Sunday, September 15 (4pm).



New Hauptwerke Virtual Organ at St. Francis Episcopal in Willow Glen

St Francis Episcopal Church 1205 Pine Ave in San Jose is now home to a new virtual organ using Hauptwerk software. This instrument is being put together by **Michael Burroughs**, Director of Music and Spiritual Life at St Francis. The first sample sets include organs from several countries and periods:

- St Michael's Church, Zwolle, Netherlands (Schniter, 1721/Flentrop, 1955);
- St Martin's in Dudelange, Luxembourg (Stalhouth/Jann, 1912);
- St Lawrentius, Rotterdam (Marcussen & Son, 1973);
- St. Etienne, Caen (Cavaille-Coll, 1885);
- St Dominica, Reti, Italy (Dom Bedos organ by Fomentelli 2007).

The organ, like three of the original sources for each sample set, is 4 manuals and range from 56 ranks up to 98.

Michael has invited AGOSJ to attend an Organ Dedication and Evensong Concert at St. Francis Episcopal in Willow Glen, 1205 Pine Avenue, San Jose, at 5:00 PM on September 15.

For a more hands-on experience of the organ the AGO will have a virtual organ crawl (no need to climb ladders since it's all in the hard drive) on **October 13** at **4 pm**. If you always wanted to play César Franck on a Cavaillé-Coll or Bach on a Schnitger.....without leaving San Jose....this is your big chance. Michael has graciously offered to give us a hands-on demonstration of the new organ, which is a Hauptwerke driven virtual organ, with digital sound samples from five impressive European instruments.

There will be three concerts as follows:

Michael has invited AGOSJ to attend an Organ Dedication and Evensong Concert at St. Francis Episcopal in Willow Glen, 1205 Pine Avenue, San Jose, at 5:00 PM on September 15. Evensong song will be sung by Resounding Achord and will feature The Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis by Roland Martin and a performance of Kim Arneson's wonderful Magnificat.

On the first Sunday in **November (3 Nov)** we have the opportunity to hear **Jonathan Dimmick** play a recital on this organ at **5 PM**.

On the first Sunday in May (3 May), Michael Burroughs will wind up his organ recital series at St. Francis by presenting an organ recital himself at 5 PM.

<u>First Covenant Church of Oakland</u>, 4000 Redwood Rd, Oakland, is looking for an <u>Organist/Accompanist</u>. This is a part-time hourly position.

Job duties include but are not limited to:

- Accompanying Choir & Worship with Organ and/or Piano for Sunday worship and special musical events.
- Attending and accompanying weekly choir rehearsals and any additional scheduled rehearsals.
- Part-Time Hourly position
- Compensation: Hourly range of \$35-45/hour (to be negotiated depending upon experience and ability); maximum of ten hours per week (inclusive of Sunday services, rehearsals and personal practice time); three Sundays a month (except for months that include a fifth Sunday); ten months per year. No benefits.
- Competence in Multi-Cultural Worship Leadership, Musical Performance, Theory and/or Education
- Ability to excellently perform classical and contemporary church music on piano and Aeolian-Skinner Organ.

The Stone Church of Willow Glen, 1937 Lincoln Ave, San Jose (408-269-1593) is an active, progressive, Presbyterian USA church. We are seeking a part-time qualified organist (10 to 14 hour/week) to play our 2 manual Schoenstein pipe organ at services to accompany our 35-voice choir at services and rehearsals. There are also weddings and memorial services where an organist is requested.

The organist will work closely with our Pastors, The Rev. Sammie Evans, The Rev. Irene Pak Lee and with our choir director, Nancy Kromm, Associate Professor of Music, Santa Clara University.

General duties and responsibilities for each Sunday and church holiday services include prepare and present a prelude, offertory, and postlude and to accompany congregational singing, pastoral cantoring, choral introits and anthems. Selected music will be appropriate to the season and special themes of the church year. The organist will be equally comfortable at organ and piano and have excellent sight-reading skills. The organist may be asked to accompany the handbell choir, children's choir, and soloists (instrumental and vocal). The organist will also be required to accompany choir rehearsals on Wednesday evenings from 7:30 to 9:30 PM. Compensation will be commensurate with experience.

AGO Specifications

Ever wondered what the AGO specifications are? I play on two different organs, one at church and my own. I find that I make more mistakes in the pedal on the church organ than on mine own. So I took out the tape measure and to see if there were differences. The length of the playing surface of the sharps at the church are 5 inches and on my organ they are 5¾ inches. The key spacing on both pedal boards was the same, 2½ inches(this is the AGO Spec) between the white keys, measured at the front end of the sharps. An internet search yielded the following document: 6½ inches is the AGO spec for the sharps.
