"The Organ In Time And Place" -- at St. Francis Episcopal Church in Willow Glen on November 3rd Richard Coulter



For those who have not seen the interior of **St. Francis's** since it was remodeled, you have a treat for the eyes when you return. What a lovely space for worship and for music!

Jonathan Dimmock proved to be more than able to provide music worthy of that space. His choice of music was great and helped us learn about the many sounds that are provided to listeners and congregants. The audience was treated to an "organ crawl" without having to climb stairs and peer into dusty organ chambers. Included were sounds from the Schnitger organ in St. Michael's church, the Cavaillé-Coll organ in Franceand, and the Marcussen organ also from the Netherlands.

Michael Burroughs, Organist and Director of Spiritual Life for the church, gave a brief introduction that included a bit of information about the organ. "It really is a computer", Michael said and of course he knows. The organ is capable of many sounds that are copied from famous and large organs in Europe and England. I personally felt that the pedal sounds overpowered the treble in all three installations that we heard. Later I learned that Michael agrees and has plans to adjust the balance.

Although the tonal resources provided a large variety of sounds, I couldn't get over the fact that we were hearing huge cathedral instruments in a rather refined space—not cathedral"esque" at all. This bothered me a bit—I enjoyed the music but felt rather at odds with the environment. Michael will happily share information about the various organs that are present in the console at St. Francis.

The first section included Bach's writing from the *Clavierübung III* with its reference to the Ste. Anne choral. In each part of this Jonathan's understanding of the writing and the inner developments of the fugal sections was clear and particularly good on the Schnitger organ.

My favorite part of the program came in the second section which included Messiaen's vision of the eternal church, Vierne's charming *Impromptu* and the wonderful, moving *Chorale in E* by César Franck. These were performed on the French organ which had a full, cathedral sound.

The third section included compositions by *Paul Halley, Herbert Brewer, Aaron Copland* (one piece arranged by Dimmock) and *David Hegarty*—all 20th century composers. Mr. Dimmock cleverly chose a 20th century installation in the *Laurenskerk*, Rotterdam, for these selections. They were all interesting—my favorite was the *Appalachian Triptych* composed in 2017 by David Hegarty.

Clearly the instrument at St. Francis adds a new dimension to the organ resources in the South Bay and we should all look forward to more concerts there. Jonathan Dimmock continues to amaze us with his fine technique and musical understanding. It was a lovely, enriching event.

We also thank Michael Burroughs the organist at St. Francis Episcopal Church and the Church Officials for their sponsorship of this event. \square



The Organ Symphonies of Louis Vierne, Stanford Memorial Church, October 2018 – June -2020
