

Dale Wood: The Man and the Music.

A New Book By Dr. James Welch

I am pleased to announce the publication of my biography of Dale Wood, one of America's favorite composers of organ music. *Dale Wood: The Man and the Music* chronicles the colorful life of this prolific composer and arranger. Essentially self-taught, Dale Wood did radio and TV work in Hollywood, played the Wurlitzer at the Orpheum in Los Angeles, was director of music for churches in Hollywood, Riverside, and San



Francisco, conducted choral workshops across the country, and finally settled at The Sea Ranch on the rugged northern California coast. There he created incomparable organ and choral music, nearly all of which remains in print, widely used, and beloved.

Wood's was an intriguing life, full of personalities and adventures. The reclusive arranger of hymns and folk tunes described himself as a

hermit, yet served in the military, drove fast cars, explored wilderness from Death Valley to the High Sierra, entertained aboard cruise lines, served as a volunteer firefighter, performed in bars, sold organs, rescued German shepherds, wrote a music drama for the exclusive Bohemian Club, and experienced an unusual variety of personal relationships.

Oldest California-Built Organ Saved

The sole remaining unaltered work of John Bergstrom & Sons, Opus 66, built in 1897 for the First Congregational Church of Sonoma, California, has been renovated and installed at The Jacuzzi Family Vineyards in Sonoma by Schoenstein & Co. When the music program of the church changed, Fred and Nancy Cline, owners of the winery, stepped forward to save the organ. Nancy Cline has a special interest in the preservation of California history. For example, the property includes an educational museum with models of all 21 California missions originally made for the

1939 World's Fair. The extensive and opulent visitors' center is in the style of an Italian villa. Its main feature is the Barrel Room, a space in Roman Basilica-style complete with apse and accommodating 250 guests, an ideal setting for banquets, weddings or concerts.

The two-manual, eight stop mechanical action, hand pumped organ fit the apse of the Barrel Room as though built for it. Even the color scheme of the decorated pipes matches. The case sides were incomplete due to the original position of the instrument, thus visitors can view the interior of the organ, which has become a fascinating educational exhibit. Although a modern blower has been added, all else is original including its A-435 pitch. The metal pipework was of special interest. Cleaning revealed meticulously made and voiced pipes of the highest caliber. Obviously, they were made in the Bergstrom San Francisco shop as they were signed in the flat "John Bergstrom & Sons". Comparing this instrument with the remnants of other Bergstroms in the area, it appears everything with possible exception of zinc pipes, keyboards, and small hardware, was made in the shop as well.



The organ was dedicated in a June 2019 ceremony with recital by John Karl Hirten. Bergstrom opus 66 has become an important cultural addition to the Northern California Wine Country.

Presbyterian Church of Los Gatos, 16575 Shannon Rd, Los Gatos, CA, is looking for a Part-Time Organist/Pianist to play one to two Sundays a month, a choir rehearsal the Thursday evening proceeding the Sunday playing, and for various church holy days. The salary is very competitive and available upon request.

Abilities: The applicant must have experience playing the organ and piano in church services and accompanying choirs and instrumentalists. Sight reading skills and a background in musical liturgy are required.

PCLG has an average attendance of 300 per Sunday. The organ is a three manual Möller from 1958, expanded twice by Schoenstein & Co. and totaling 39 ranks. It has been fastidiously maintained by Schoenstein & Co. The sanctuary has a Baldwin grand piano, which has had recent voicing and action work, and a Kohler & Campbell grand in the choir room.

The adult Chancel Choir has approximately 30 voices and sings at most Sunday services from early September to the second week in June, as well as for several services in the summer. The congregation is enthusiastic about all kinds of music, with a special appreciation for the pipe organ.

The church currently needs a third organist, who would join a rotating roster with two other organists. Each organist plays one or two times a month throughout the year, depending on the number of Sundays in a month. When the choir is in session, the organist playing a Sunday service usually rehearses with the choir the previous Thursday. The organist uses a piano during the choir rehearsal, which is held in the choir room and led by the music director. The rotating organists decide their schedule, based on their availability and in collaboration with the music director.
