Free Resources for Church Musician During the Pandemic

I received the following information from James Leek of the Leek Pipe Organs (james@leekpipeorgans.com)

The pandemic has forced many churches to cease or reduce its employment of musicians. If you are still able to work, you may have had to adapt to using technology in new ways for virtual practices and live stream services.

During this difficult time, lean on a community that understands your unique needs. You likely have many questions such as:

- 1. Do I qualify for unemployment benefits?
- 2. Will live streaming/posting worship violate copyright laws?
- 3. Is it safe to have musicians and choir members in the church?

We want you to get the support you need to continue doing what you love.

One License

An easy and convenient way to get music publishers' permission for live-streaming or broadcasting music during online church services is for your church to buy an annual license from One License (<u>onelicense.net</u>). The price for their licenses varies, based on the average weekly attendance of your congregation. Here is One License's summary of what their licenses provide:

"Through ONE LICENSE, License Holders have access to thousands of congregational hymns, songs, and service music from today's top liturgical music publishers to use in worship aids, service bulletins, and projections to inspire congregational singing. Our list of Member Publishers is regularly growing, and as new ones join, you will immediately have access to their catalogs."

<u>Presbyterian Church of Los Gatos</u>, 16575 Shannon Rd, Los Gatos, CA, is looking for a <u>Part-Time Organist/Pianist</u> to play one to two Sundays a month, a choir rehearsal the Thursday evening proceeding the Sunday playing, and for various church holy days. The salary is very competitive and available upon request.

Abilities: The applicant must have experience playing the organ and piano in church services and accompanying choirs and instrumentalists. Sight reading skills and a background in musical liturgy are required.

The church currently needs a third organist, who would join a rotating roster with two other organists. Each organist plays one or two times a month throughout the year, depending on the number of Sundays in a month. When the choir is in session, the organist playing a Sunday service usually rehearses with the choir the previous Thursday. The rotating organists decide their schedule, based on their availability and in collaboration with the music director.

Streamed Tabernacle Organ Recitals

The Tabernacle Choir at Temple Square begin a livestream organ recital series from the Salt Lake Tabernacle on Temple Square which started on the 22nd of June. Noon (Mountain Time) recitals have now resumed via the internet, without an audience, three days a week, Monday, Wednesday, and Friday.

A new feature is the recitals have a host, **Dr. Luke Howard** who is an Associate Professor of music history at BYU and a member of the Choir. He introduces the pieces that are to be performed and tells about the composers as well. He also provides comments in the running Chat column.

Rheinberger 14th Sonata in C Major Review Andrew Larson

So I think Rheinberger knocks another one out of the park with this Great Masterpiece!!! This work was written in late November of 1890 and published the following year. Compositionally this is the most sophisticated thus far, but doesn't quite reach the emotional heights of Sonata 12, but I would this is a close 2nd to that great work. All three movements demonstrate a definite progression stylistically.

The opening Praeludium in C is a brilliant piece of work that skillfully combines elements of a classic prelude and fugue into a larger implied sonata form. It follows an ABcBc/Coda on A and B format and Rheinberger displays extraordinary resourcefulness in his manipulation and development of the kernel rhythmic motif of two sixteenths and an eighth. The B section is a fabulous fugato and the C is a beautiful secondary theme if you will. Besides the above mentioned characteristics there are many delightful unexpected harmonies and modulations that take place throughout that will keep you on the edge of your seat!!

The very effective Idylle movement is in F and follows a typical ABA structure. The lovely A section is quite evocative of the namesake idyllic countryside, perhaps that of a quiet stream on a summer morning. As can be found in a number of these Rheinberger slow movements, the reiteration of the A section features some beautiful harmonic reinterpretation. The B section is most distinct and takes us up into the mountains with very effective melodic call and response episodes. These are simply wonderful as Rheinberger gradually embellishes what is a very simple theme that is built into grandiose statements at the end of the section.

The Sonata ends with a stunning Toccata, but I must take note that this has NOTHING to do with the classic French style, and is in fact the only such toccata for organ in Rheinberger's output! Formally this movement alludes to a sonata rondo, but as is typical in these sonatas, Rheinberger avoids anything close to strict adherence. There are three distinct themes, one of which is a striking chorale like tune which reappears several times with modifications. As in the first movement, there are many unexpected harmonies and There is a strong forward thrust modulations. throughout which Rheinberger carefully throttles on into the brilliant ending.

Three Free Organs

Michelle Kinkaid <u>MichelleKinkaid5678@gmail.com</u> (415-802-3325) has three organs that she is giving away.

The first one is a **Thomas Theater organ**. It was working when it was moved to a storage area.

The second one is a **Hammond Spinet** (looks like a M100 series), two short keyboards (44 keys) and 13 pedals. This organ was turned on in the last few days and it appears to be working correctly.

The third one is a **Hammond A122** (serial 28422) organ with 25 pedals. This organ was turned on in the last few days and it is NOT working correctly. When you press a key, all you get is a hum. The Hammond A122 will sound like the Hammond B3. If one is interested in this organ, one could contact Camp's Organ Service (925-294-8633) www.campsorganservice.com for repair – an initial service call is \$215 minimum for a diagnostic of the problem.

Free Rodgers Organ 750BE Organ

The organ model is Rodgers Organ 750BE. Requires external speakers and the speakers are not included. The organ is free, but call Sophia to be sure it is still available and how long it will be local. Not sure of the city, but it is not too far away from Los Gatos, (408) 497-3488.

The organ's dimensions are 48 inches high, 48 inches wide, 30 inches from keys to back of the organ, 48 inch pedal board depth, total depth of organ and pedal board is 54 inches. This is an approximation but should give you an idea of the size.
