Dean's Column

Greetings, Everyone!

 \mathcal{A} s the COVID storm subsides, there are encouraging signs that the organ world is carefully steering the ship toward calmer water and a safer harbor.

One of these signs was a wonderful in-person organ concert at **Bethlehem Lutheran Church** in **Monterey** on Sunday, October 24. It was the 60th anniversary of their **Laukhuff Organ**, one of the first tracker action organs on the west coast, which had just undergone extensive repair and upgrading. This was celebrated by a rededication recital given by **Walter Krueger**, **Dean of the AGO**, **Portland**, **OR Chapter**. Among other accomplishments, Dr. Krueger earned a D.M. from Northwestern University and has attained the rank of a Fellow of the AGO, and the corresponding CMM rank in choral music.

 \mathcal{F} or his program, **Dr. Krueger** expertly chose pieces that showed the



versatility of the Laukhuff organ he was showcasing. After a short, festive procession of bell ringers from the congregation, Dr. Krueger launched into a big Buxtehude piece, followed by another Baroque offering, the well-known Concerto in A minor by Vivaldi/Bach. Next came a lovely and imaginative Suite by Walter Pelz on Nicolai's "O Morning Star, How Fair and Bright". Dr. Krueger took time to explain that this tune was

written during a pandemic in Germany, the plague of 1597, in which hundreds of Nicolai's parishioners died. Nicolai wrote to comfort them, setting reassuring words of scripture to music.

A variety of compositions followed, A Mighty Fortress by Reuter (great, great uncle of the performer) Toccata by Dubois, Variations on "New Britain" by Dahl, Alleluias by Preston, Reverie by William Grant Still, "Electa ut sol" by Dallier, and Fantasy on a Hymn Tune by Carl Schalk, written by the performer in honor of his teacher, a piece which one audience member commented "left her in a happy place"!

Space limits further comments on these wonderfully attractive pieces, a varied palatte that kept the audience enthusiastically tuned in until the very end! I hope to learn some of them myself!

 \mathcal{N} ext we were treated to a reception graciously hosted by Bethlehem Lutheran. They offered delicious goodies artistically arranged by the church members. Ah, an in-person reception with real food and enthusiastic, live conversations. Remember those? They are coming back!

Bethlehem Lutheran Church Laukhuff Organ

Brief History of the Laukjuff Organ:

Ground-breaking for Bethlehem Lutheran Church at 800 Cass Street was held on 7 Jun 1959. Founded in 1925, Bethlehem had been located for 35 years on Pine Street in Pacific Grove. A fine pipe organ must have been envisioned from the very beginning, because just two years later, in 1961, the organ by August Laukhuff of Weikersheim, German Federal Republic, was installed and dedicated (12 Nov 1961).



The design of the organ was drawn by Prof. Hugo J. Gehrke from California Concordia College, Oakland, according to strict Baroque principals, making it most suitable for the performing the music of J. S. Bach and others from the Golden Age of Lutheran Music. It further represented a growing Neoclassic Organ Reform Movement which began in the early 1950's. Our Lukhuff was one of the very first such instruments of the West Coast featuring mechanical (tracker_ action for keys and stops. The installer was John West of San Francisco. The Rev. Arnold Steinbeck, then Bethlehem pastor, wrote of the

instrument "...the only full organ of tracker action on the Monterey Peninsula."

Normally, organ refurbishments are needed every 25 to 30 years. It was not until our Laukhuff's 60th year (2021) that a restoration was determined. Bond Organ Builders Incorporated from Portland, Oregon was hired for the refurbishment that included replacing the mechanical stop action with and electric one. This had the side benefit of facilitating combination action which greatly enhances performance possibilities. In addition, regulation of many pipes brought the sound of the organ up to original effect. Project manager was Joe O'Donnell with voicing by Gran Edwards.

Early this morning, Libby Codd passed on peacefully. She wanted it that way. She asked for permission to go last week. She went on her own terms. Family members visited her, FaceTimed her and called her this past week.

Mom was our energizer bunny. At age 97.5, her body just gave up...She had a wonderful life. She grew up in Cambridge, Mass. She graduated from Brimmer School in 3 years. She graduated from Radcliffe College in 3 years with a degree in Music. She went on to Tufts to obtain a graduate degree in Occupational Therapy. She worked in as an OT before she was married and again after her youngest was in school.

She met my father at a social dance at St. Bartholomew's Church in NYC and they married later that year. She had 4 well-adjusted children, all of whom grew up to be independent successful adults. She leaves behind a legacy of 7 grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren.

She loved to play the piano. She was an accomplished organist. She passed on her love of music to each of her children and grandchildren. She taught others to play the piano.

She was always active in her community. She served as President of the San Jose AAUW. She was active in the Unitarian Church. She was a member of the AGO and the Radcliffe book club. She supported all sorts of liberal social causes. She wrote articles for the Forum's monthly Gazette. She was a member of the Forum's chorus for many years.

She was an avid hiker (like her father) for some time and participated in many Sierra Club hiking and camping trips. She walked and finished the Bay to Breakers three times (7.6 miles across San Francisco) at the ages of 90, 91 and 93.

Over her lifetime, she traveled the world. At age 95, she accompanied me, Ron and Susie on a month-long trip/cruise around South America and Antarctica. She was able to board the Zodiacs, climb up the snow-covered hills onshore, mingle with the penguins and walk 4.5 miles around Santiago, Chile at the end of the trip.

She will be sorely missed but she is now at rest and we can be happy for that.

We love you, mom. Rest in peace.
