

News of the Weird An Organ Recital for the Very, Very Patient

Last year in the May 2006 Newsletter we reported about an organ concert that will last 639 years (of John Cage's "As Slow As Possible" is being performed in St. Burchardi Church in Halberstadt, Germany). We report that the piece is continuing and include a small write up obtained from

http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/As Slow As Possible. This article contains more details and some notes about the piece written by John Cage. It also contains a portion of the first measure so that you can see the interesting beginning chords.

The piece started on 5 Sept 2001 with 20 months of silence (the piece starts with a rest). Chords changes occur on the 5th day of a



month (Cage's birthday). The first notes were heard on 5 Feb 2003 (two G sharps and a B in between). Notes will sound or cease once or twice a year. The last change occurred on 5 May 2006 (two E pipes were removed from the chord) and the next change will take place on July 5, 2008. (G sharp, F sharp, C and A, in descending order.) The organ was encased in a Plexiglas enclosure due to the complaints of the neighbors. The first movement of the five movement piece will end

in 71 years. The piece will be complete in the year 2640. Also see http://www.musicweb-international.com/classrev/2007/Apr07/Cage PSe.htm

Her organ work continued with St. Marks, Santa Clara; St Edwards, San Jose; and St. Judes, Cupertino as well as the Baptist Church on 10th St., San Jose, and a Lutheran Church in Los Gatos. Besides her organ work, her first love was as a classical pianist, studying under Lois Banke of Monte Sereno, CA. She was loved by all who knew her.
