FRASIER ORGAN SCHOLARSHIP 2009

The application **deadline** for the 2009 Frasier Organ Scholarship is coming up fairly soon: **March 20, 2009** (postmark deadline). As a reminder, the scholarship is open to current chapter members and to organ students studying with or sponsored by current members (previous winners are not eligible). The Frasier Organ Scholarship will be awarded on the basis of demonstrated talent and potential, and must be used for specified continuing education in organ studies. The scholarship amount for 2009 will again be \$1000.

Jacques Littlefield 1949-2008

Jacques Littlefield passed away 7 January. He was 59.



Mr. Littlefield's fascination with armored vehicles began in his childhood when he started building plastic models of tanks. While in college, he built his first scale model, radio-controlled tank. He acquired his first full-sized vehicle in 1975. In 1998 he set up the military Vehicle

Technology Foundation to manage his collection of more than 150 vehicles and restore new additions. The collection ranges from World War II-era U.S. Army M3A1 wheeled scout car, his first acquisition, to a Soviet-era Scud missile launcher. It includes famous tanks such as the U.S. Sherman and Patton class; the U.K. Centurion, Conqueror and Chieftain; German World War II vehicles, including a Panther; and Soviet-era Russian tanks.

He was considered a scholar and expert on the history of armored warfare, and the foundation helps serve the interests of authors, historians, educators, the defense industry, veterans groups, model makers and the entertainment industry, say family members.



Jacques Littlefield was an organist who studied under Stanford University organist Professor Herbert Nanney. He had this large 45 rank Fisk organ (Opus 91) in a purpose-built hall attached to his house. Area organists (especially students from Stanford) are able to use the instrument for practice. Incidentally, Jacques also is interested in railroads. He has a 1-foot (or so) live steam railroad with

bridges and a tunnel on his ranch.

Sunday, January 25, 2009, the San Jose chapter presented the annual student organ recital. This year's program was held at West Valley Presbyterian Church in Cupertino and featured 6 organists, ranging in experience from one year to international performer. We were treated to superb playing on a wonderful instrument, a 3 manual Allen Renaissance Organ. The organ has 6 different voicings: American Classic, English Cathedral, Orchestral, Baroque, Neo-Baroque, and French Renaissance.

Sarah Devlin, 16, has been studying the organ for a little over a year with Pat Milstead. Her selections were "When Jesus Wept" arranged by Charles Callahan and "Rejoice the Lord is King" arranged by Gordon Young.

Albert Bellefeuille, 8th grade, has been playing keyboards for five years and studying organ for the last three. He has been working with Dr. Sandra Soderlund for the past two. He played Buxtehude's "Magnificat Primi Toni", BuxWV 203.

Chinar Merjania, 14, has studied piano and organ with her mother since the age of four. Her first piece was Sinfonia from Bach's Cantata "Wir Danken Dir, Gott", arranged by Homer Whitfird; second was "St. Thomas" arranged by Edwin T. Childs.

Michael Wright earned a BA in music performance; is the Music Director at St. Nicholas Catholic Church; teaches music, choir and band at St. Martin of Tours School; is presently working on a Masters Degree in Liturgical Music and Pastoral Liturgy at Santa Clara University; has studied organ with Dr. James Welch for the past four years. He chose to play "Trio Sonata I in E Flat" by J.S. Bach and "Awake, Awake, for Night is Flying", arranged by Wilber Held.

Susan Snook-Luther, a Stanford graduate with a B.A. in Music, M.A. in Performance Practice and Ph. D in Musicology, has been studying organ with Berdie Bowlsby for the past two years. Her selections - "Iona Boat Song" by J.N. White and "Concerto in A minor" by J.S. Bach – were a study in contrasts of classical and contemporary music and exhibited the wide range of registrations available on the organ.

The program closed with **Dr. James Welch**, international performer and teacher, treating us to two of his favorites – "Toccata in F, BWV 540" by J.S. Bach and Improvisation on "Ode to Joy" by Richard Elliott.

In a number of pieces we heard some very unique, but lovely registrations.
