Thoughts Regarding Sacred Music:

 \mathcal{A} recent discussion about music in worship has caused my brain to do some cartwheels. It seems that this topic will come up every few months or years. There are articles from the 15th century and, I would venture to guess even before that, trying to justify one point of view or another.

It is important for me to try to explain my view on the subject in order to help me clarify that view. My graduate degree is a Master of Sacred Music from a very prestigious school of sacred music meaning that my professional training was in this field. Some people feel that this should mean I'm qualified to play or discuss music from any style and that the music we use on Sunday morning should represent a wide variety of styles. Unfortunately, such is not the case.

It is a bit like what happens to my medical conditions: when my shoulder hurts, my primary care physician sends me to an orthopedic specialist....or—when my hearing goes bad, he sends me to an audiologist. Thus, my primary care physician—who is a fine doctor—doesn't attempt to treat all my medical problems—only the ones with which he is comfortable.

Since my training, and interest, was in classical sacred music, I am not qualified to be conversant in jazz, blues, rock and roll, country western or any of the other styles considered to be outside the field of sacred music. CHAPTER FEBRUARY EVENT Elisabeth Pintar

On Sunday, February 27, 2011 our chapter co-sponsored with University of Santa Clara an All-Bach Organ Concert by Dr. James Welch at the Santa Clara Mission Chapel. This was very well attended by University students, organ lovers and many in our Chapter. The chapel's décor provided a treat for the eves while the acoustics for the two-manual Schantz organ tickled the ears. Dr. Welch offered commentary on the pieces throughout the concert, bringing an intimacy to the event for all involved. Carefully selected registration for each piece showcased the sounds of the organ and how inspired J.S. Bach's music truly is. The accuracy, articulation, stylistic approach, and technique were all performed in a relaxed manner without sacrificing the intended result or tempo of each piece. The concert ended with the Passacaglia and Fugue in c minor but left the audience wanting just a little more. So, Dr. Welch performed "Bist du bei mir" where the use of strings were used, contrasting sharply with the ending of the Passacaglia and Fugue. I always determine how effective a concert is by how I walk away from one. Dr. Welch's concert inspired me to recommit myself, once again, to become a better organist through careful practice, attending more concerts and never stop learning what the organ offers to us as musicians. You will have the option to make a donation to the Region IX Convention, a professional card to be included in the printed convention book, an option to help defray your registration processing costs.
