WHY NOT APPLY FOR THE FRASIER 2013 ORGAN SCHOLARSHIP?

It's not too late to add another New Year's resolution to your list for 2013. Why not encourage that organ student to apply for the Frasier Organ Scholarship, or consider applying for it yourself? Improving your organ skills, and resuming or continuing your organ studies would be an excellent resolution to add to your personal list. If you're a member of our San Jose AGO chapter and haven't won the Frasier scholarship before, you too are eligible to apply. In fact, if you read over the list of past Frasier Organ Scholarship winners, you may be surprised at how many names of current members you find on that list. Organists of varying ages and experience have been Frasier applicants and winners over the years. JULY 21-27 PIPE ORGAN ENCOUNTER

The national A.G.O. has been sponsoring an educational outreach program for many years. It is called Pipe Organ Encounter and it is designed to introduce students ages 13 – 18 to the world of the pipe organ. Many piano students have become "hooked" on the pipe organ through this fantastic program, including none other than concert organist. Chelsea Chen. Rani Fischer (San Jose/Palo Alto dual member) and her committee have been hard at work for several months already on this week-long event to be held July 21 - 27, 2013. While Stanford University and its spectacular organs will be a focal point of this week of lessons, workshops and recitals for the kids, there are also field trips planned, to San Francisco, to the Stanford Theater, and to Santa Cruz. Volunteers are needed for many aspects of this event. In particular, the POE committee is asking the San Jose chapter to provide snacks and chaperones for a day in Santa Cruz on Thursday, July 25. Scheduled stops include "Boomeria" in Bonny Doon, Holy Cross Church, and the Beach/Boardwalk. It will be a

fun day spent with 20 young people! There are vans leaving from Palo Alto that can pick volunteers up in Cupertino in the late morning and deliver them back in the evening.

There are other ways to get involved, too. If you can donate a couple of hours, the whole week, or anything in between; do let us know!

SPARLING CONCERTS, NOVEMBER 2013 PAUL ROSAS

The origin of the concept of this series of programs came out of my annual fund raising concert for the Alzheimer's Association. I have been doing the concerts for 4 years and it struck me one day that I had never heard of the AGO doing any concerts for the community.

The members of the AGO have been complaining that "no one comes to the concerts" or on the other side "who wants to go to hear an organ?"

My solution has been to become associated with an organization that has helped my family when we were going through a health crisis with my wife's parents. Another reason for this link is that the pastor's wife, Bonnie Bollwinkel, works with the Alzheimer's Association and has also had members of her family who have died of Alzheimer's. Our church, consequently, has a membership that is very devoted to raising money for the Alzheimer's Association.

The "Sparkling Concerts" came from an idea of the pastor's wife. She said that the caretakers get so tired of the constant vigilance that they lose their energy and stamina. They need to get their sparkle back with the help of the Alzheimer's Association. I liked the idea so much that I wanted to get the San Jose Chapter of the AGO involved and began discussion with members of the board. It took several meetings before I had a clear enough vision that we could develop together. Once we clarified that we wanted

three concerts in one weekend (Friday, Saturday and Sunday) and that we wanted other instrumentalists to join us, we used our combined resources to create a concert with handbells and organ; voice and organ (with a piano / organ duet thrown in); and brass and organ. We then used our various contacts, called local organists and instrumentalists and set up the concerts.

The other aspect of the concerts is PUBLICITY. Most concerts are only advertised in the AGO Newsletter and at one church. I have been a member of the Silicon Valley Arts Coalition for 2 years. This group of 22 performance art groups was founded for the express purpose of providing lower cost advertising in local community papers as well as free and low cost Internet listing. I used my knowledge gained by this a membership to put advertising in local papers and 9 Internet sites. A link was put on the posters and programs that allowed people to donate online directly to the Alz Assoc. The Alzheimer's Association also helped to put ads for our concerts on their website. We received \$150 in online donations.

RESULTS:

The first concert, "Sparkling Handbell", had posters, announcement to the choir and connections with the various handbell members to boost attendance to over 100 people. They raised \$470.

The second concert, "Get Your Sparkle Back", had the best advertising – church web site, church newsletter, posters, announcements to choirs and small groups, Emails to Alzheimer's walkers. There we about 150 people in attendance. We raised \$3800.

NOTE: This church is the home of the largest Alzheimer's walking group as well as the group that has raised the most money for Alzheimer's.

The third concert had no posters, one sentence in one Sunday bulletin, no contact with any of the musicians on staff and no contact with the priests of the church. There were about 25 people in the audience, most having some connection with the musicians or the AGO. We raised \$240 dollars.

CONCLUSIONS:

We had the best results when the church staff, ministers and various groups at the church supported and promoted the program AND when there was at least two months of publicity at the church to support the concert and the purpose of the concert.

My big question is "How do we get people outside of the organist circle and the Alzheimer's circle to come to the concerts?". What will motivate them? Shall we do the concert series again next year?

JULY 21-27 PIPE ORGAN ENCOUNTER The POE at Stanford University is on schedule for July 21-27, 2013 in Palo Alto, CA. We have our housing, teachers, guests, and schedule in place. Come January we will be accepting applications for twenty students on a first-come, first-serve basis, which has been the precedent at all past POE's. The students and a few staff will stay at the Vallombrosa Conference Center in Menlo Park, CA, since the dorms at Stanford are being renovated. We have ten teachers for our twenty students, all incredible both musically and pedagogically, including Stanford's own Robert Huw Morgan. Our three young guests who will also teach are Weston Jennings, Nicole Marane, and Adam Detzner. The first two are currents at the Eastman School of Music, while Adam is currently studying at Stanford.

Our schedule is packed, but not too packed as to be oppressive. We have three trips planned. John Karl Hirten has kindly offered to lead a tour of San Francisco on Monday. We hope to visit the Legion of Honor and St. Mary's Cathedral while we are there, as well as do some sightseeing, such as the cable-car hub. On Wednesday we hope to drive to Benicia to meet Jack Bethards at the storied Schoenstein firm. On Thursday of that week, we are planning a fun day in Santa Cruz. Not only will we hear the organ at the spectacular Holy Cross Church, but also visit a crazy place called Boomeria which is sure to appeal to teenagers and adults alike: http://home.comcast.net/~pqboom/tour/pipeorgn. html. Finally, we end our trip on the boardwalk with its carnival atmosphere, full of games, amusement and surf.

Each night at 8 PM we will offer a public recital either at Memorial Church at Stanford or at a neighboring church. We are making arrangements for an introduction to the theatre organ at Stanford Theatre with the Mighty Wurlizter. In addition, we hope to climb up to the carillon in Stanford's Hoover Tower for an acoustic and visual treat. There is so much to do and so much to be gained from a POE. The experiences and friendships last a lifetime. I hope you will be a part of it, either as a

volunteer, or as a financial supporter. The amount doesn't matter.

As you can imagine, new expenses creep up, though I hope most of the creeping is over. Our big items are housing, security background checks, airfare for guests, and van transportation. At this point we need a total of \$5,000 to meet all our needs. After that, we expect to be done with fundraising. Our other big needs are for airfare miles, chaperones, drivers, and snack arrangers.
