 \boldsymbol{I} don't know where these commandments originated, but I have fond memories of my organ teacher in college quoting his favorites to me. He especially loved the comment about "the thick people" and the spent Odor-Eaters. May these commandments and golden rules bring musical joy to your spring!

 \mathcal{T} he Ten Commandments of Organ Practice

- . Thou shalt practice every day, even if only for a short period.
- 2. Thou shalt NEVER practice faster than thou canst play perfectly, for it is written: Perfect Practice Makes Perfect.
- 3. Thou shalt NOT put off working on the hard parts; David did not invite Goliath to come back after tea.
- 4. Thou shalt work out a usable fingering, inscribe it on thy papyrus and NEVER vary from same, for Fumble Fingers Find Fate Fickle.
- 5. Thou shalt never apologize for the playing, nor say "Oops!" when thou makest a mistake, for thou wilt only draw attention to things which otherwise would never be noticed by the thick people.
- 6. Thou shalt practice each composition in short segments; that thy fingers may not break off more than thy mind can chew.
- 7. Thou shalt listen... and not only to organists, for it is written: What this untidy world needs is fewer organists and more musicians who can play the organ.
- 8. Thou shalt NOT play pedals without shoes... for the Odor-Eaters may be spent, and besides, it leads to sloppy playing.
- 9. Thou shalt begin and end each practice session with something thou canst play readily that thou mayest not be discouraged.
- 10. Thou shalt always remember that thy practice is a labor of love and that by persistence, oft proved by thyself in other undertakings; thou canst bring to pass many wonders.

Golden Rules for Ensemble Singing:

- 1. Everyone should sing the same piece.
- 2. Take your time turning pages.
- 3. Do not worry if you do not have perfect pitch you may find singing less stressful without it!
- 4. The right note ant the wrong time is the wrong note.
- 5. The wrong note at the right time is still a wrong note.
- 6. A wrong note sung timidly is still a wrong note.
- A wrong note sung with authority is an interpretation.
- 8. A true interpretation is realized when not one note of the original remains.

- 9. If you happen to sing a wrong note, give a nasty look to one of your neighbors.
- 10. If everyone gets lost except you, follow those who get lost.
- 11. If you are completely lost, stop everyone and start an argument about repeat marks.
- 12. Strive to achieve the maximum notes per second that way you at least gain the admiration of the totally incompetent.
- 13. If a passage is difficult, slow it down. If it is easy, speed it up. Everything will work itself out in the end.
- 14. Markings for slurs, dynamics, ornaments and breathing should be ignored. They are only there to embellish the score.
- 15. When everyone else has finished singing, you should not sing any notes you may still have left.

2013 FRASIER SCHOLARSHIP WINNER

Congratulations to **Kirim Eom**, the winner of the 2013 Frasier Organ Scholarship! The Frasier auditions were held on Saturday afternoon, April 20. Our chapter will present Kirim with the \$1000 award at our Annual Membership Meeting on Sunday afternoon, June 9.

Kirim studied piano for seven years, and organ for two years (2004-5), in her native Korea. She studied music composition at Sook-Myeong Women's University (Seoul, South Korea), and accompanied worship services on piano in Korea for nearly twenty years. Last July she began organ lessons with Dian Ruder at Valley Church in Cupertino, and has played preludes, offertories, and postludes for worship there on several occasions. She plans to use the Frasier scholarship to continue her organ lessons and improve her skills at the organ.

For her Frasier audition, Kirim performed "Prelude, Fugue and Chaconne in C Major" by Dietrich Buxtehude, "Meditation" by Gabriel Dupont, "Moto Perpetuo (Toccata)" by Robert Jones, and the hymn "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty" (*Lobe den Herren*).

Our San Jose AGO chapter extends sincere appreciation to Joyce Rhodes, Carolyn Pryor, and Dick Coulter, who served as the three judges for this year's Frasier scholarship auditions. We also thank Sunnyvale Presbyterian Church for graciously allowing Kirim to practice and prepare her audition pieces there, and for hosting the Frasier auditions.

SCHOENSTEIN ORGAN FOR GEORGETOWN UNIVERSITY

Schoenstein & Co. is building an organ for the historic Dahlgren Chapel of Georgetown University in Washington, DC. The instrument of three-manuals and 19 ranks will be located in two matching cases on either side of the sanctuary and speaking directly down the nave. The organ has two enclosed divisions with a double expressive sub-division in the Swell. One of the two 8' Diapasons in the Great and the 16'/8' Pedal Diapason are unenclosed. The tonal design is along symphonic lines and includes, in addition to solid chorus work, two celestes, Oboe and Clarinet, high pressure Tuba Minor, and four 16' stops. The third manual borrows solo and ensemble stops from the Great and Swell. Installation is planned for January, 2014, to coincide with completion of the chapel's renovation. The Director of Music and Liturgy is James A. Wickman. The Organ Consultant is Lynn Trapp, Director of Worship & Music, St. Olaf Catholic Church, Minneapolis, MN. 9 April 2013. J

MUSICAL TERMS

ALLREGRETTO: When you're 16 measures into the piece and realize you took too fast a tempo

ANGUS DEI: To play with a divinely beefy tone

- A PATELLA: Accompanied by knee-slapping APPOLOGGIATURA: A composition that you regret playing
- APPROXIMATURA: A series of notes not intended by the composer, yet played with an "I meant to do that" attitude
- APPROXIMENTO: A musical entrance that is somewhere in the vicinity of the correct pitch
- CACOUGHANY: A composition incorporating many people with chest colds
- CORAL SYMPHONY: A large, multi-movement work from Beethoven's Caribbean Period
- DILL PICCOLINI: An exceedingly small wind instrument that plays only sour notes
- FERMANTRA: A note held over and over and over and over and . . .
- FERMOOTA: A note of dubious value held for indefinite length
- FIDDLER CRABS: Grumpy string players
- FLUTE FLIES: Those tiny mosquitoes that bother musicians on outdoor gigs
- FRUGALHORN: A sensible and inexpensive brass instrument
- GAUL BLATTER: A French horn player
- GREGORIAN CHAMP: The title bestowed upon the monk who can hold a note the longest
- GROUND HOG: Someone who takes control of the repeated bassline and won't let anyone else play it

PLACEBO DOMINGO: A faux tenor

- SCHMALZANDO: A sudden burst of music from the Guy Lombardo band
- THE RIGHT OF STRINGS: Manifesto of the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Violists
- SPRITZICATO: An indication to string instruments to produce a bright and bubbly sound
- TEMPO TANTRUM: What an elementary school orchestra is having when it's not following the conductor (also common in municipal bands and community orchestras)
- TROUBLE CLEF: Any clef one can't read: e.g., alto clef for pianists

Silicon Valley Symphony conducted by Michael Gibson featuring World Premiere of "An American Experience" (originally for organ) by Lothar Bandermann, Elgar's"Enigma Variations", and Saint-Saëns, "Organ Symphony," Margaret Kvamme, organist. (See Page 6, 17-18 May for location, times).

"An American Experience" is a series of very short (~1 min) vignettes each with a title referring to an American character trait (like "bold", "hurried, etc.) which particularly impressed me as an immigrant (1960) from Germany. This is a patriotic piece (dedicated to the great John Steinbeck), to be sure, with two short quotations ("Oh Say, Can You See." and "America the Beautiful"): About a week after the concert is also Memorial Day
