1, 2 & 3 NOVEMBER CHAPTER EVENTS ALZHEIMER'S BENEFIT CONCERTS

The Alzheimer's Concerts were sponsored by the San Jose Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, three benefit concerts given by chapter members and volunteers on three successive days. **Paul Rosas**, organist at Los Altos United Methodist Church, organized the series at three different venues throughout Silicon Valley. All proceeds go to the Alzheimer's Association. A total of \$4937 was collected at the three concerts.

The First Concert was held on Friday, Nov 1 at 7:30pm at the Holy Cross Lutheran Church. 15885 Los Gatos Almaden Rd. The Ed Lacina Brass Quartet presented a dynamic concert with organist Carolyn Lamcke.

The first in this year's series of Alzheimer benefit concerts, Music FOR Memories, featured brass, organ and voice at Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Los Gatos.

The program opened with Martin Shaw's "Grand Processional on Lobe Den Herren" arranged for brass and organ by Dale Wood. Organist **Carolyn Lamcke** joined the **Holy Cross King's Brass** for the rousing start to a delightful evening.

Brass players **Don Stillwell** and **Bob Acosta** on trumpets, **Ed Lacina** on French horn, **John Olson** on euphonium, and **Kirk Zimmer** on tuba treated the audience to a George M. Cohan Medley arranged by Paul Nagle and Ralph Vaughn Williams's English Folk Suite.

Carolyn Lamcke, who is also a teacher and brass player as well as pianist and organist, played three pieces by Richard Purvis, "Ascription", "Hymn to the Moon", and "Earth Carol". She ended the first portion of the program with "Thanksgiving" by Clifford Demarest and accompanied her son, Leslie Lamcke, who sang a version of Irving Berlin's "Blue Skies".

The second half of the program featured Gabrieli's "Canzona per sonare No. 4" arranged by Eberhard Ramm for brass, "Tango" by Tom Kirkland, "You Raise Me Up" by Josh Groban, and "Next Stop: Funksville" by John Wasson, which the brass players enjoyed as much as the audience.

Buxtehude's "Fugue a la Gigue" and Frank Bridge's "Minuet" made the evening seem more like a lively dance venue than a boring organ concert.

Carolyn's sparkling registration of "A Song from the East" by Cyril Scott was definitely the highlight of the

evening. It was followed by her playing of "Come, Holy Ghost, Creator Blest" by Robert Hebble.

Vocalist **Leslie Lamcke** again treated the audience, this time with a Freddie Mercury tune, "Crazy Little Thing Called Love."

The program concluded with Raymond David Burkhart's "Rejoice" for brass and organ.

The Second Concert was held on Saturday, Nov 2 at 3pm at the Los Altos United Methodist Church, 655 Magdalena Ave, Los Altos. The featured works were "A Sweet for Mother Goose" by John Akerely for organ and narrator. The 7 poems of Camille Dungy "What to Eat, What to Drink and What to leave for poison" have been set to music by Paul Rosas and were sung by 4 superb sopranos--Anne Janzer, Becky Everett, Casie Walker, and Laura Lang-Ree.

The Third Concert was held on Sunday, Nov 3 at 3pm at the **Los Gatos Presbyterian Church**, 16575 Shannon Rd, Los Gatos, CA 95032 and featured **Diane**

Keller and two bell ringing groups, **Larry and Carla Sue** as well as the bass bells of the **Los Ding Zone**.

Diane led off with the stately Maestoso in C# by Louis Vierne, followed by a perpetual motion Humoresque by Pietro Yon.

Carla and Larry Sue played four contrasting numbers on bells: By the Light of the Silvery Moon, Nobody Knows the Trouble I've Seen, Bach's Arioso, and Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee. They held two bells in each hand and they told me afterward that each song uses 8 pitches, which may not be the same for each piece. They don't change bells while playing. Larry Sue arranged the music, and the harmonies were satisfying and complete even within that narrow range.

Diane returned with Lang's cheery Tuba Tune followed by the Scherzo from Vierne's sixth Symphony.

Next, the four members of the Low Ding Zone rang lovely arrangements also by Larry Sue, The Bells of St. Mary, Holy Manna, and Danny Boy. This group played larger lower pitched bells, one in each hand.

Diane explained that she liked scherzos and proceeded to play one by Whitlock, followed by Joplin's toetapping The Entertainer.

More bell duets followed—Ma Navu, a melancholy Israeli tune, Holst's In the Bleak Midwinter, and A la Media Noche.

Diane crowned the concert with an impressive performance of the Final from Vierne's Symphony #6

During intermission Paul Rosas told of his experience with his mother's Alzheimer's, and the need to support more research.

VIOLA ORGANISTA

The viola organista was an experimental musical instrument invented by Leonardo da Vinci but never built by him. It is a bowed keyboard instrument and it has the sound similar to a cello. Polish pianist Slawomir Zubrzycki, who also builds musical instruments, has taken Leonardo' note and sketches and constructed a "viola organista." It's a hybrid of harpsichord, organ, and viola da gamba: when the performer strikes a keyboard a series of little wheels covered in horsehair, like rotary bows, then "play" the strings.

Benicia, CA – Please join us on **Sunday, December 8, from 2-5 p.m.** for an Open House at our **Benicia plant**. On display will be the 3-manual, 19-rank organ destined for Georgetown University in Washington, DC. The historic Dahlgren Chapel has been completely renovated and will be a fine home for the new organ. You can tour the entire facility and see the development of our archive of west coast organ history.

Directions: From I-80: At Vallejo, take I-780 east towards Benicia. After East Fifth St exit, get into right lane and exit onto I-680 North (Exit 7A). From I-680: At Benicia, take the Lake Herman Road exit (Exit 61). Go east (toward the water) on Lake Herman Road and cross the railroad overpass. Take the first right onto Industrial Way and go 1.3 miles. The plant is on the right just past a curve – look for the 42' tall erecting room!

Ability to accompany soloists and/or choirs as necessary is also required. Salary: To be negotiated; dependent on experience and skill level.
