FRASIER WINNERS' RECITAL Friday June 12th featuring KIRIM EOM & KIRK WAILBLINGER

Come hear an exciting organ recital showcasing our two most recent Frasier Organ Scholarship winners, **Kirim Eom** (2013 winner) and **Kirk Waiblinger** (2014 winner). The recital will be at **7:30pm** at the **Los Altos United Methodist Church** (655 Magdalena Ave. in Los Altos), with an informal reception following in the church's Redwood Room.

Kirim Eom played the piano for worship accompaniment in Korea when she was young, and continued to study music composition in university there. She is studying music again in English now at De Anza College. A student of Dian Ruder, Kirim won the Frasier scholarship in May 2013. In recital, she will be performing Eleanor Whitsett's *"In Dulci Jubilo,"* three chorales by J.S. Bach and Max Reger, Frederick Swann's *"Festival Toccata on St. Anne,"* a Larghetto by Handel, and *"When the Roll is Called Up Yonder"* by Joyce Jones.

Kirk Waiblinger is a senior at Mountain View High School. He has been studying the organ for five years with Diane Keller. Since taking up the organ, he has loved performing complex solo In addition, he has substituted as pieces. accompanist for several churches, giving him the several excellent opportunity to play on instruments. This fall, Kirk looks forward to attending college as a physics major, with a potential second major in music. In recital, he will play Bach's C-Major Toccata, Adagio, and Fugue

(BWV 564), the finale from Vierne's Symphonie no. 3 (op. 28), and "<u>From the World of My Father</u>" by Herman Berlinski.

Mark your calendars and plan now to attend this wonderful recital featuring Kirim Eom and Kirk Waiblinger. We will honor both performers with an informal reception following the recital. 2015 FRASIER WINNER

Congratulations to **Nicholas Welch**, the winner of the 2015 Frasier Organ Scholarship! The Frasier auditions were held on Saturday afternoon, May 16, at Los Gatos Presbyterian Church. Our San Jose AGO chapter will present Nicholas with the \$1,000 award and acknowledge him at an AGO event next fall.



Nicholas has been studying organ for three years with his father. James Welch. He also studied piano for ten years, both

with his father and with others: Elizabeth Neil, Virginia Fruchterman, and Russell Hancock. Nicholas has held positions as LDS ward organist, LDS choir pianist, and as substitute organist for Christian Science and Seventh-Day Adventist churches. He plans to use the Frasier Scholarship to further his music study, which he hopes to continue at the college level. His goal in studying music is to "gain a performance-worthy level of proficiency that will serve me and others well throughout my lifetime." Nicholas is currently a junior at Gunn High School in Palo Alto. He is also an Eagle Scout, is good at math, loves to ski, and completed the "Sharkfest" swim from Alcatraz to San Francisco.

For his Frasier audition, Nicholas performed "Fugue in G Minor, BWV 578" by J.S. Bach, "Toccata" from Suite Gothique by Léon Boëllmann, "La Nativité" by Jean Langlais, and the hymn "Jesus Shall Reign Where'er the Sun" (*Duke Street*). Although memorization was not required, he performed his entire audition (except the hymn) from memory.

Our San Jose AGO chapter extends sincere appreciation to Carolyn Pryor, Diane Keller, and Dick Coulter, who served as the three judges for this year's Frasier scholarship auditions. We also thank Los Gatos Presbyterian Church and host organist Margaret Kvamme for graciously allowing the Frasier applicants to practice and perform their audition pieces there.

THE INVENTOR OF THE PIANO BARTOLOMEO CRISTOFORI

You may have never heard of Bartolomeo Cristofori, but you definitely know his invention. Cristofori was an Italian musical instrument maker credited with inventing the pianoforte, or: the piano. One of his biggest innovations was creating a hammer mechanism that struck the strings on a keyboard to create sound. The use of a hammer made it possible to produce softer or louder sounds depending upon how light or hard a player pressed on the keys. In fact, that's how Cristofori's new instrument got its name - in Italian, piano means soft, while forte means loud. Being able to change the volume was a major breakthrough. And that's exactly what Doodler Leon Hong wanted to highlight in this interactive Doodle. We talked to Hong to get the inside scoop on how this musical Doodle came to be.
