

We held our **Annual Meeting, Hymn Sing and Potluck** at the **Prince of Peace Lutheran Church** in Saratoga. In the Annual Meeting the chapter members approved the board members (as list on page 1) for the coming year. This was followed by a Hymn Sing and a pot luck dinner.

Title: Variations on an Old and, Sometimes New Song/Hymn

The San Jose Chapter of the American Guild of Organists and guests participated in the singing of hymns and were treated to organ variations and accompaniments by chapter members. Hymns ranged from the very familiar to the new and unfamiliar.

Dian Ruder opened the program with Rejoice, Ye Pure in Heart (Marion) and played an Emma Lou Diemer arrangement.

Mike Cala followed with his own improvisation of Let All Things Now Living (The Ash Grove).

All present sang the familiar O, Worship the King (Hanover) at the request of **Charles Cramer**, who then played a bright, elaborate arrangement by William Thomas Best.

Susan Snook-Luther combined a Paul Manz setting of God of Grace (Cwm Rhonda) as an interlude to the singing of verses of the hymn. Afterwards she played an arrangement by Michael D. Costello.

Cecelia Lung enlisted the assistance of David Snook-Luther and Michael Wright as vocal leaders for the singing of a Tanzanian melody Neno Lake Mungu to the words of Listen, God is Calling. Anne Karentz arranged this new hymn in the piece that Ms. Lung showcased.

Michael Wright closed out the program with Alleluia! Sing To Jesus (Hyfrydol) and a jazzy arrangement by David A. Schack entitled Lord of Glory, Who Has Bought Us. This is the second year that the San Jose Chapter has organized this type of event, which is proving to be popular with members and guests. Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Saratoga hosted this year's event. The organ is a 3 manual Allen electronic organ. \square

FRASIER WINNERS' RECITAL FRIDAY JUNE 12th FEATURING KI RIM EOM & KIRK WAIBLINGER

We heard an exciting organ recital showcasing our two most recent Frasier Organ Scholarship winners, **Ki Rim Eom** (2013 winner) and **Kirk Waiblinger** (2014 winner). The recital was held at the **Los Altos United Methodist Church** with an informal reception following in the church's Redwood Room.

Ki Rim Eom played the piano for worship accompaniment in Korea when she was young, and continued to study music composition in university there. She is studying music again in English now at De Anza College. A student of Dian Ruder, Kirim won the Frasier scholarship in May 2013. In recital, she will be performing "In Dulci Jubilo" by Eleanor Whitsett, "Chorales for Lent, Easter, and Pentecost" by J.S. Bach and Max Reger, "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder" by Joyce Jones (selection for pedals only), "Larghetto" by Handel, and "Festival Toccata on St. Anne" by Frederick Swann's.

Kirk Waiblinger is a senior at Mountain View High School. He has been studying the organ for five years with Diane Keller. Since taking up the organ, he has loved performing complex solo pieces. In addition, he has substituted as accompanist for several churches, giving him the opportunity to play on several excellent instruments. This fall, Kirk looks forward to attending college as a physics major, with a potential second major in music. In recital, he played Bach's "Toccata, Adagio, and Fugue in C-Major" (BWV 564) (it also has a pedal solo and most of it was memorized), "From the World of My Father" by Herman Berlinski, and the finale from Vierne's Symphonie no. 3 (op. 28).

The music we heard was fantastic. Both Ki Rim Eom and Kirk Waiblinger have great skill.
