AGO NATIONAL CONVENTION IN HOUSTON, TEXAS, JUNE 2016 THOUGHTS FROM JOYCE E. RHODES

This convention was a surprise! My expectations were substantially exceeded.

A few thoughts, I can't begin to cover every point...

All workshops were in the morning, a change from all other AGO conventions I've attended. I liked this, which left the recitals and worship services in the afternoons and evenings. Most workshops were conveniently located in the hotel. I found I was "fresh" and ready to become fully engaged in the presentations and to engage in discussions.

Marketing tips were presented and discussed by Carol Nave and Patrick Pope, clinicians. Instead of listing ALL of their ideas, I learned that I am already using some of their ideas. I have to do so much more to engage and bring others to appreciate and love the organ and all it has to offer. If I used just some of their ideas, audiences would certainly grow. "Communication is interactive and is two ways", one of their points. "The audience comes to you via search engines, referrals and social media. You provide value to your audience through content. Your promotional efforts seek to educate, inspire and engage." Sound advice for any type of program: church service or recital.

In his opening remarks, Dr. John Walker, FAGO, President, AGO, reminded us that the <u>local chapter is the</u> heart of AGO.

Attending the "Rising Stars Recitals" was a highlight. These talented, young organists give me confidence that organ and its music is in good hands. Each STAR was truly a star!

Husband/Wife team, The "Duo MusArt-Barcelona", Maria Teresa Sierra, piano and Raul Prieto Ramirez, organ, was exciting, firey and interesting. Their program included music by Widor, Langlais along with Lutostawski, Gershwin, Horowitz, arranged by the artist himself. Many times it sounded like many more instruments being played than just the organ and piano.

Worship services were varied, with many interesting and beautiful hymns, old and new. Listening to variations between verses included accompaniment, a-capella and voicing. Nice to hear all women, or all men on some verses. I could truly appreciate the words and feeling.

I am always amazed and awestruck at the sound of an entire congregation singing! At even "singing churches" where the congregations can be considered a "singing congregation", there still is nothing like hearing a congregation of 1500 choristers! This alone makes attending an AGO convention worth the cost of travel, registration, meals, etc.

"Halle, Halle, Halle: We Sing the World 'Round'", was a service incorporating music of all nations, opening with a solo voice singing the hymn while leading the processional of several choirs. Everyone then joined in, clapping on the off-beats – hard for those of us not used to clapping on any beat. The thread of this service was opening and closing with the same hymn. The choirs lined the walkway and continued to sing as everyone left the sanctuary and headed back to the buses....and we all sang the entire time even while walking to the buses. Very inspirational.

Sung Compline service at the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, at 10:45 p.m., was a beautiful and emotional way to end a very full and inspirational day.

Ah..so much better than I expected!

MY VIEW OF THE AGO HOUSTON CONVENTION BOB RHODES

One of my pleasures in life is to share these conventions with Joyce every couple of years. So Houston it was for me too this year, not as an organist, but as spouse, choir member, and devotee of a classical repertoire.

Boston is hot in July; D. C. is hot in July; Houston is very hot in July. But all of the venues are very cold, making it a challenge to transition from Hotel, to bus, to church venue and back. As the 4th largest city in the U.S., Houston has many very large churches of all persuasions, with very large pipe organs and very large choirs. Combine these with 1,500 enthusiastic organists and friends and you have a series of very exciting worship services (well, some could be called performances, I guess). Almost a week of three or four daily events is "going to church" a lot. But what a heavenly experience to be flooded with inspirational pipe and song, without sermon or offering.

And they all finished on time (a must when the buses are waiting to travel to the next venue.

Similar to other recent Conventions, a cell phone app was available which included the entire Convention schedule. Easy to understand (for most of us) clicks allowed for your own personal schedule, including bus departure times. And under each event information on the specific program and venue could be displayed. Truly a great improvement upon the traditional Convention Publication. The only function that failed me was the post-Convention evaluation.

There were several new compositions commissioned for the Convention. One of my favorites was at the closing event which incorporated poetry, pipes and visions of the earth and stars from the International Space Station and Hubble telescope. It was quite awesome and unique, qualities that made it memorable for the 2,500 or so attendees.

Before and after the Convention time we visited the Houston Museum District, including the Museum of Natural History and the Buffalo Soldiers' Museum. The latter was dedicated to the exploits of our African American military men and women from the Civil War through today's space program. We also travelled to the Houston Space Center and relived the history we witnessed in real time over the years. If you should travel to Houston, be assured that you can easily get around on public transportation, at very reasonable prices, especially if you are as mature as we are.
