LOTHAR BANDERMANN'S LENT MUSIC MEDITATIONS

Lothar Bandermann, organist at **St. Joseph's Church** in Cupertino, 10110 N De Anza Blvd. arranged a series of three delightful Lent Musical Meditations from **12:30 PM to 1:00 PM**.

On 24 March **Lothar Bandermann** played a program comprised of his own compositions. He started with *Litany #7*, then *Largo for Lent* (on the name of "James Welsh"), followed by Variations on *Folk Songs from Around the World* (five different pieces).

PEDALS, PIPES, AND PIZZA

Our annual PPP was held on **18 March 2017** at **Immanuel Lutheran Church**, 14103 Saratoga Ave, Saratoga. This event is sponsored by our chapter members to give more exposure to the instrument that we love. Fourteen students participated this year. We wish to thank **Elisabeth Pinter** for organizing and conducting the event. Helping was **Mike Cala**, **Susan Snook-Luther**, **Carolyn Lamcke**, and **Kenneth Talbot**. The students were divided into two groups. While the first group played the organ the second group would visit the organ chamber and were also shown different types of organ pipes. After a set amount of the time, the groups exchanged places. Before and during the event the organists played various organ pieces (Bach, Hymns, Theater style, etc.) so that the students could hear and appreciate the majesty of the organ.

Each student played his/her piano piece on the organ. **Mike** and **Carolyn** helped the students set the registration on the organ for the piece they were going to play. **Susan** took pictures of each student so we could identify them later on for the group picture. A number of the pieces were even played several times with different registrations so that the student could hear how different registrations can affect the presentation of the piece. One of the students, Grace, played very well. She brought her organ shoes and she used both feet.

For the second group **Elisabeth** explained how the organ worked, the types of pipes, and the purpose of the different divisions. **Kenneth** demonstrated the small samples of pipes we have and explained how the pipes produce the sound and what the various parts are called.

Everyone had a good time and there was plenty of pizza afterward. We also thank **Elisabeth Pinter** the organist at **Immanuel Lutheran Church** and the **Church Officials** for their sponsorship of this event.

BYU Organ Workshop Concert Elisabeth Pintar

The night before the BYU Organ Workshop began a Hymn Sing and Organ Concert was given on Friday, March 3rd. Two out of the five organists were from our own San Jose Chapter. Each organist played 1-2 pieces in addition to accompanying the congregation on a hymn of their choice, showcasing various arrangements and registrations to the hymns. The organists that performed were: Elisabeth Pintar (San Jose member), Valerie McDougal, Kimberly Payne, Elizabeth Forsyth (San Francisco member), and Harold Stuart (San Jose member). Ms. Payne had a large screen

showcasing the Salt Lake Temple Hill Orchestra with a pre-recording of Gustav Holst's "The Planets, Op. 32, 1"and "Mars, the Bringer of War" and then played live, technology at its best! Mr. H Stuart ended the concert with an original composition for one of his pieces. The concert was a little over an hour in length but many enjoyed singing and listening to all!

BYU Organ Workshop Pat Milstead

On March 4th members of the Chapter were offered a wonderful opportunity by the San Jose South Stake of the Mormon Church and Brigham Young University. **Dr. Don Cook**, head of the organ department at BYU and several of his staff presented a morning of free workshops to help organists and would be organists improve their skills. Approximately 168 people attended the workshop. There were 4 programs each for 3 levels of participants:

- 1. Those under 18 (and there were a LOT of them). Purpose was to show them what the organ can do.
- 2. A segment designed to give attendees info to make them more confident at the organ
- 3. A track for organists comfortable at the console looking for further inspiration.

Here are some ideas from the last category:

TEXT is most important aspect of any hymn. As organists, we teach the Gospel. What is the theme of each verse?

STEPS TO LEARN A HYMN: Study the text, decide how to handle repeated notes (adjust the length of the rests between), fingering and pedaling, learn each part separately, decide the registration.

TIES: tie from strong to weak, never tie soprano to soprano, look for common tones, if soprano rises, tie it into alto; if it falls break the alto. Chords: tie the inner voices or tie alto and bass.

CREATIVITY IN REGISTRATION:

For jubilant hymns use bright stops with 2', add mixture, couple SW (8,4,mix)/GT (8,4,2), add reeds.

Use Pedal Point I or V played low in intros, on last verse

Get rid of bass in hands – play it with your feet

Warm sound – all 8' stops on one manual played in tenor range. Also try Krummhorn +Celeste in tenor range. For tenor solo take it up an octave.

Learn to play alto and tenor with LH. Add pedal. Put together.

PEDAL – Heels together for intervals thru a 4th. Knees together 5th and above. He recommends walking around with knees together as an exercise.

A surprise of the day was how much emphasis was placed on the AGO including having a small segment given by Matthew Burt and the handout of a brochure about the AGO.

These workshops are being given all over the country by BYU and are certainly fostering the extensive use of the organ in the young people. The presenters were anticipating 65 people and 160 signed up. An added bonus was the breakfast and lunch which were provided all participants.

OPEN POSITIONS

<u>Presbyterian Church of Los Gatos</u>, 16575 Shannon Rd, Los Gatos, CA, is looking for a **Part-Time Organist/Pianist** to play one to two Sundays a month, a choir rehearsal the Thursday evening preceding the Sunday playing, and for various church holy days. The salary is very competitive and available upon request.

Abilities: The applicant must have experience playing the organ and piano in church services and accompanying choirs and instrumentalists. Sight reading skills and a background in musical liturgy are required.

PCLG has an average attendance of 300 per Sunday. The organ is a three manual Möller from 1958, expanded twice by Schoenstein & Co. and totaling 39 ranks. It has been fastidiously maintained by Schoenstein & Co. The sanctuary has a Baldwin grand piano, which has had recent voicing and action work, and a Kohler & Campbell grand in the choir room.

The adult Chancel Choir has approximately 30 voices and sings at most Sunday services from early September to the second week in June, as well as for several services in the summer. The congregation is enthusiastic about all kinds of music, with a special appreciation for the pipe organ.

The church currently needs a third organist, who would join a rotating roster with two other organists. Each organist plays one or two times a month throughout the year, depending on the number of Sundays in a month. When the choir is in session, the organist playing a Sunday service usually rehearses with the choir the previous Thursday. The organist uses a piano during the choir rehearsal, which is held in the choir room and led by the music director. The rotating organists decide their schedule, based on their availability and in collaboration with the music director.

Holy Redeemer Lutheran Church, 1948 The Alameda, San Jose, CA, is looking for a Part-Time Musician. We are looking for about 300 hours per year (~ 6 hours per week). These hours include: Sunday morning for worship, five special services during the year, staff meeting each month, about 16 choir practices during the year (the choir only sings on Festival Sundays and a few other Sundays during the year). Solos on the weeks that they do not sing. The balance of the time would be made up in personal practice and other small tasks.

We have a Shafer & Sons Grand Piano in the sanctuary and the former director supplemented it with a drum machine, a keyboard and an organ which he owned. We are looking for a direction musically at this time and are open to discussions with the new musician.

We have budgeted \$6500/year for this position. Additionally there are 2 weeks of vacation (paid substitute) and the normal benefits (FICA, etc.). We do not offer health care.



The article is too long to include in the newsletter. The first paragraph gives an excellent overview of the content of the article. I think that each of you may want to read it.

Johann Sebastian Bach was one of the greatest musicians throughout the music history. He was a supreme composer, organist and teacher. The Baroque period reached its zenith in the Bach's music. In this essay, I will discuss reasons for the acknowledged greatness of Bach's music. I will use specific examples from his various works.

There are many of you who could give (or contribute to) recitals, and we have many excellent instruments. And we should have an annual "Members' Recital," as other chapters have. The famous Cameron Carpenter has said that the organ is a dying instrument. Let's prove him wrong, friends!

From AGO Headquarters New AGO Dues Structure

A new membership dues schedule was approved at the January 2017 meeting of the AGO National Council. Several notable changes were also made to membership categories to better meet the needs of our changing constituency. All changes take effect on April 1 for new members, and on the renewal date for renewing members with expiration dates beginning on or after July 1, 2017.

Dues

For the first time in two years, modest increases were made across all membership dues categories in response to rising costs of operating a national not-for-profit membership association while combating declining membership totals.

Increased operating costs include new and expanded educational programs and the committees that support them, compliance with recent mandates imposed by the Federal Trade Commission, and costs associated with strategic planning to ensure a healthy future for the Guild. The dues change also includes increased support for local chapters. A discount of \$8 is available to all members who elect to receive electronic delivery of TAO rather than a printed copy. Local chapters will receive the same local dues portion as they do for members who choose printed magazine delivery.

Membership Categories

The Student membership category (for full-time students) was eliminated and replaced with the Young Organist membership category. This change is to make AGO membership affordable not only for students, but also for recent college graduates who may be seeking employment or working in entry-level positions. The Partner membership category was eliminated. Partner members paid a reduced rate because they did not receive a second copy of TAO sent to the same address as the primary member. That discounted rate was disproportionate to the actual cost of mailing a second magazine. Partner members still enjoyed 100% of membership benefits.

FAOs

Are my membership dues going up?

If you are a Regular, Special, or National Subscriber: Yes, your dues will go up by \$5. Your local chapter and the national organization will both receive portions of this increase. However, if you choose electronic delivery of TAO, your dues will go down by \$3.

If you are a Student member: Yes, your dues will go up by \$10 when you renew as a Young Organist member. If you choose electronic delivery of TAO, your dues will go up by only \$2.

If you are a Partner member: Yes, your dues will go up by \$30 if you renew as a Regular member and by \$5 if you renew as a Special member. Your dues will go up by \$22 if you renew as a Regular member or down by \$3 if you renew as a Special member and choose electronic delivery of TAO.

How do AGO membership dues compare to other similar music organizations?

AGO dues are competitive or less than those of comparable music organizations: Regular AGO membership bundled with a printed TAO subscription is 16% less than ACDA and RSCM, 15% less than NAfME (formerly MENC) and 10% less (on average—dues vary by state) than MTNA.

In addition to the cost savings, are there other advantages to electronic delivery of TAO?

Yes. TAO is already available in electronic form to all members through the AGO website. Those who read the magazine online can take advantage of recorded sound samples of the instruments featured on the cover, hyperlinks from display ads to websites, as well as online keyword and article searches. Of course, there are environmental advantages, as well, to online publishing.
