# Aaron Tan, Organ Recital

The Mary Ann Gee Memorial Recital performed by Aaron Tan was held on 17 May 201 at the Campbell United Methodist Church, 1675 Winchester Blvd. Campbell. Arron selected

special music for this recital for remembering Mary Ann. If you missed the recital you missed a splendid recital with a wide variation of musical numbers the showed off the organ and his talent. Aaron's presentation was well organized and very polished.

He started with music from Joseph Jongen (1873-1953) with Toccata, op. 104 and a set of quiet pieces, Prière from *Quarte Pièces pour Orgue*, op. 37.

He then turned to remembering Mary Ann Gee. He started by playing the "Mary Ann Fugue" composed by Lothar Bandermann, who was present. Next the congregation sang Mary Ann's favorite Hymn "Before the Marvel of This Night." At its conclusion, he the played an Improvisation of the Hymn. Next he played two

selections from *Paysages Euskariens* by Joseph-Ermend Bonnal (1880-1944). The two selections were "i. La Vallee du Béhorléguy, au martin" and "iii. Cloches dans le ciel."

After a brief intermission Aaron continued with the Étude no. 5 from *Six Études*, op. 5 ("notes répetées") which, as it says, repeat hundreds of pedal notes a rapidly as possible (yes, it is a pedal exercise piece – but still quite nice). It was written by Jeanne Demessieux (1921-1968). This piece took considerable skill to perform this piece)

Next we heard "Frandole from *L'Arlesiemme Suite no.2* by George Bizet (1838-1875, transcribed by Joel Hastings (1069-2016). This was done very nicely, just as the orchestra would have done it. We then heard La Nuit from *Trois Impressions*, op. 72 from Sigrifd Karg-Elert (1877-1933) which contain very lovely melodies. The concluding piece was Final from *Symphony* no. 6, op. 59 by Louis Vierne (1870-1967) which is very grand organ work.

The encore was Bach's Little Fugue in A Major.

Aaron Tan is a Canadian organist, engineer, and pianist. He has won numerous noteworthy contests and scholarships on both instruments including the First Prize and Audience Prize at the prestigious AGO National Young Artists (NYACOP) competition in 2018. Other competition prizes and awards include the Toronto RCCO Young Organists Competition, the Osborne Organ Competition of the Summer Institute of Church Music (Ontario), the RCCO's National Organ Playing Competition, the Charlotte Hoyt Bagnall Scholarship for Church Musicians, the Lilian Forsyth Scholarship, the West Chester University Competition, the Arthur Poister Scholarship Competition, the Sursa American Organ Competition, and the XVI Poland International Piano Festival Competition. His primary musical tutelage has been with John Tuttle, David Palmer, and Joel Hastings.

Mr. Tan is currently studying at the Institute of Sacred Music at Yale University and also serves as Organ Scholar at Church of the Resurrection, New York City. Previously he has served as Organ Scholar at St. John's Episcopal Church, Detroit, Michigan, Artist in Residence at the Cathedral Church of St. Paul, Detroit, and Assistant Organist at Christ Church Cranbrook, Bloomfield Hills, Michigan.

As a scientist, Aaron holds a Ph.D. in Materials Science from the University of Michigan and worked there as a postdoctoral researcher after earning his degree, studying polymer thin films.

# Winner of the 2019 Frasier Organ Scholarship

Congratulations to Ruth Kamas, the winner of the 2019



Frasier Organ Scholarship! The Frasier auditions were held on Sunday afternoon, April Los at Gatos Presbyterian Church. Our San Jose AGO chapter will present Ruth with the \$1,000 award and acknowledge her at our annual meeting and hymn

sing on June 2 (4pm at Campbell United Methodist Church). Ruth has been invited to be a featured performer on our annual student recital next year, in January or February 2020.

For her Frasier audition, Ruth performed the Prelude in C Major, BWV 553, attributed to J.S. Bach; a chorale prelude on "Herzlich tut mich verlangen," by Johannes Brahms; "Pasticcio" by Jean Langlais, and the hymn "God, Whose Giving Knows No Ending" (*Beach Spring*).

Ruth began organ lessons in 2011 with Barbary Grant, and has been studying with Margaret Kvamme for the past 3.5 years. Over the past three years, Ruth has participated in three POE events — at Stanford, in San Diego, and in Illinois. She has also been studying piano (since 2010) and voice. Ruth is currently a student at West Valley College, and is still deciding on career options, which will likely include playing organ.

Ruth currently serves as organist at Our Lady of Peace Catholic Church, and has served as a substitute organist at St. Lucy Catholic Parish. For the past several years she has accompanied the Regina Pacis Homeschool Choir on organ, both for rehearsals and Mass. Ruth plans to use the Frasier Organ Scholarship for music books and for continuing her private organ lessons. Her goals in studying music are to further her knowledge of music and organ, to become a better church organist, and to enjoy music.

Born and raised in San Jose, Ruth was home-schooled until she began her college studies, which gave her a lot of time to pursue her musical studies. Ruth's parents and five siblings say that they do not mind her practicing at home on her Conn theater organ in the early morning without headphones on. In her free time, Ruth referees soccer, plays with her younger siblings, and enjoys "vanishing into a good book."

Our San Jose AGO chapter extends sincere appreciation to Dick Coulter, Diane Keller, and Dian Ruder, who served as the three judges for this year's Frasier scholarship auditions. We also thank Los Gatos Presbyterian Church and host organist Margaret Kvamme for graciously arranging practice sessions and the Frasier audition there.

PCLG has an average attendance of 300 per Sunday. The organ is a three manual Möller from 1958, expanded twice by Schoenstein & Co. and totaling 39 ranks. It has been fastidiously maintained by Schoenstein & Co. The sanctuary has a Baldwin grand piano, which has had recent voicing and action work, and a Kohler & Campbell grand in the choir room.

The adult Chancel Choir has approximately 30 voices and sings at most Sunday services from early September to the second week in June, as well as for several services in the summer. The congregation is enthusiastic about all kinds of music, with a special appreciation for the pipe organ.

The church currently needs a third organist, who would join a rotating roster with two other organists. Each organist plays one or two times a month throughout the year, depending on the number of Sundays in a month. When the choir is in session, the organist playing a Sunday service usually rehearses with the choir the previous Thursday. The organist uses a piano during the choir rehearsal, which is held in the choir room and led by the music director. The rotating organists decide their schedule, based on their availability and in collaboration with the music director.
