Presbyterian Church of Los Gatos, 16575 Shannon Rd, Los Gatos, CA, is looking for a **Part-Time Organist/Pianist** to play one to two Sundays a month, a choir rehearsal the Thursday evening proceeding the Sunday playing, and for various church holy days. The salary is very competitive and available upon request.

Abilities: The applicant must have experience playing the organ and piano in church services and accompanying choirs and instrumentalists. Sight reading skills and a background in musical liturgy are required.

The church currently needs a third organist, who would join a rotating roster with two other organists. Each organist plays one or two times a month throughout the year, depending on the number of Sundays in a month. When the choir is in session, the organist playing a Sunday service usually rehearses with the choir the previous Thursday. The rotating organists decide their schedule, based on their availability and in collaboration with the music director.

Streamed Tabernacle Organ Recitals

The Tabernacle Choir at Temple Square begin a livestream organ recital series from the Salt Lake Tabernacle on Temple Square which started on the 22^{nd} of June. Noon (Mountain Time) recitals have now resumed via the internet, without an audience, three days a week, Monday, Wednesday, and Friday.

A new feature is the recitals have a host, **Dr. Luke Howard** who is an Associate Professor of music history at BYU and a member of the Choir. He introduces the pieces that are to be performed and tells about the composers as well. He also provides comments in the running Chat column.

Categories of AGO Chapter Membership

VOTING GENERAL MEMBERS (age 30-64) consist of organists and choral conductors and other individuals who support the purposes of the Guild and who:

- 1) shall be approved by the Chapter,
- 2) shall be elected to membership by the National Council,
- 3) have paid the dues and fees set by the National Council.

Voting General Members are eligible to:

- 1) take Guild examinations for certification,
- 2) be nominated for election to Chapter, Regional, and National Office,
- 3) serve on National Committees,
- 4) vote in Chapter, Regional, and National elections,
- 5) receive the official journal of the Guild (The American Organist).

VOTING SPECIAL MEMBERS – age 65 or older, or disabled

All of the items listed for Voting General Members apply to Special Members.

YOUNG ORGANIST MEMBERS – under the age of 30

All of the items listed for Voting General Members apply to Young Organist Members.

CHAPTER FRIENDS shall consist of those individuals who:

- 1) support the purposes of the Guild,
- 2) are NOT organists or choral conductors,
- 3) have paid the dues and fees set by the Chapter.

The privileges of **Chapter Friends** are:

- 1) participation in Chapter activities,
- 2) receipt of Chapter publications.

Chapter Friends

- 1) shall require no election to membership,
- 2) shall have no vote,
- 3) cannot be listed on our Chapter Substitute Organist list.

There are also **DUAL GENERAL, DUAL SPECIAL, AND DUAL YOUNG ORGANIST** categories for those who wish to belong to more than one Chapter. All of the items listed for Voting General Members apply to Dual Members.
