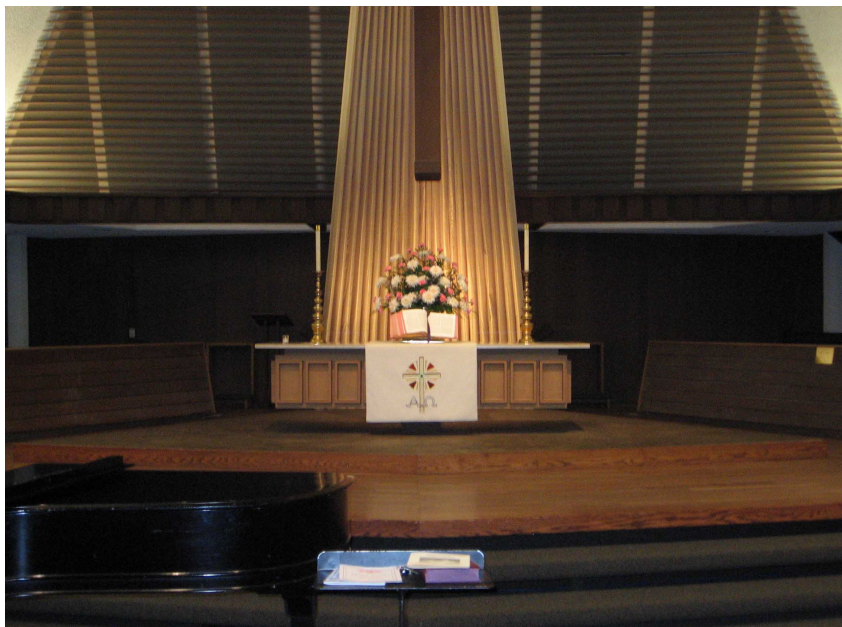

The 32' is a Peterson brand electronic playing out of a large cabinet with a single 15" woofer. This is only for the bottom 12 notes then it goes to the Bourdon 16' pipes for C2. Also electronic is the bottom 8 or so notes of the Pedal Principal 16'. It was all there in the Schoenstein previous installation but there just wasn't room for those long pipes for it to go down all the way in the new layout, so Schantz "electrified" those bottom notes. They are open wood, small scale in the upper range. Roger Inkpen
