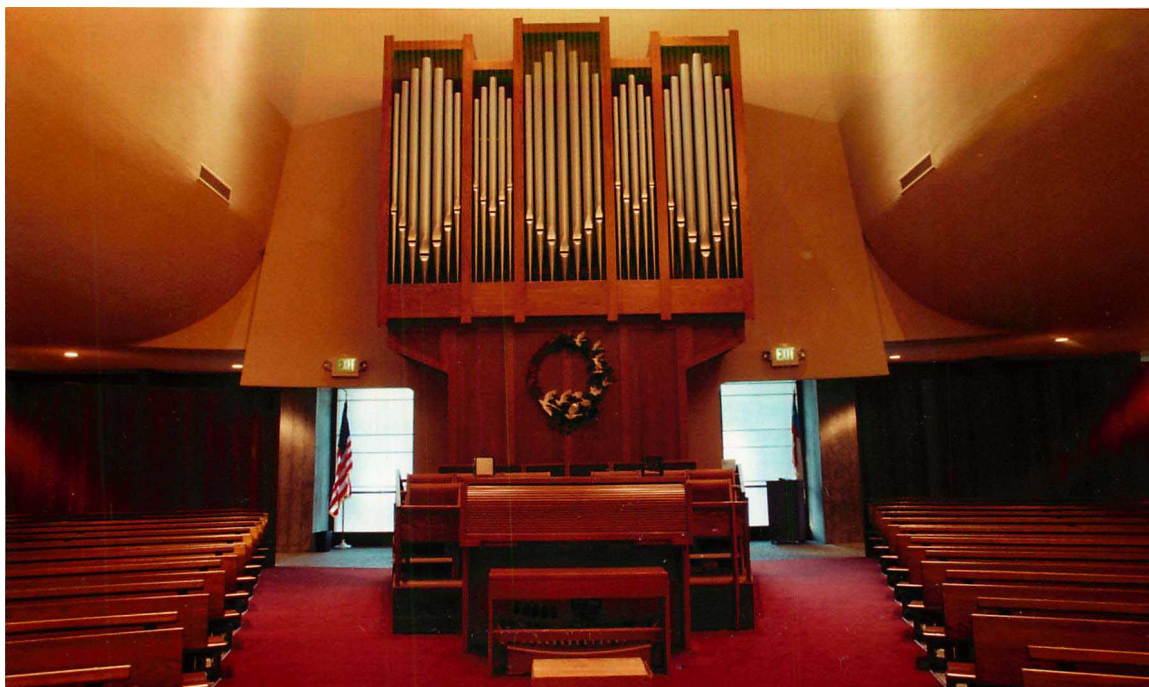

## OUR SCHOENSTEIN ORGAN

The desire for an organ to facilitate parish worship at St Timothy's was first recognized when the current sanctuary was constructed in 1970, and initial discussions with Schoenstein began in 1982. It took several years, however, for the parish to refine their vision of the scope of the instrument and to allow the details of design and implementation to be defined. Modification of the building and construction of the organ began in early 1988 and the dedication recital by Kristina Sunquist, the Associate Rector, took place on September 25 1988.
