HANDEL HOUSE MUSEUM IN LONDON CAROLYN PRYOR

While in London I visited the Handel House Museum

which is the actual house that Handel lived in from 1723 until his death in 1759. It is located at 25 Brook St., London W1K 4HB website: www.handelhouse.org Ten years this house has opened to the public and is the first museum in London dedicated to a composer. The ground floor is occupied by a business, but other than that, the entire house is the actual museum. They have tried very hard to faithfully recreate the rooms, especially the bedroom to look exactly as they did when Handel lived there. Although the building is small, there is an elevator so the entire museum is wheelchair accessible. You enter from the rear. There is a modest charge. You take the elevator to the 2nd floor. The first small room is running a constant video (beautifully done) as an introduction to the museum. Then you enter the London room. In each room are laminated sheets to read – info on the room, and specific info on all of the paintings on the walls. Also there are many docents on each floor to answer questions. (That may not always be the case – I was there on their 10th anniversary!) Next is the bedroom with a 4 poster bed with lovely red fabrics. It is short but according the docent, everyone slept sitting up with lots of pillows. Next comes an exhibition room, and then an Activity area which included free materials for children and families to take. Going down to the 1st floor you enter the composing room! This is the room in which Handel wrote many works, including The Royal Fireworks and Messiah! Standing in this room was a thrill. Also on this floor are a small rehearsal/performance room (there are concerts given frequently) which has a beautiful

harpsichord such as Handel would have had. Then

there are two more exhibition rooms. Visiting this house was one of the top highlights of my trip! If you
