NEXT YEAR'S DUES PAYMENT

AGO headquarters has developed a new online method (called OnCard) to collect next year's dues. Each of you will be contacted by headquarters via Email or Regular mail, probably in a month or two. They are slowly sending out requests so that their system will not be overloaded. Those who do not have an Email address will receive a normal mail notice (so we have been told).

It is best to login into the OnCard system now so that your personal information is correct before they send your Dues Notice. To get ready for the OnCard system, login to the OnCard system and update your Update Personal Information. The following address is the login page.

Go to https://www.agohq.org/oncard-login/

First time login: Your user name is the first letter of your first name followed by your last name. (Do not include apostrophes, hyphens, or spaces). Your password is your member ID which is found just to the left of the date on the address label of The American Organist magazine. Once you are logged in, click on "Update Personal Information," update your personal information and "Submit" it.

2014 Frasier Scholarship Winner



Congratulations to **Kirk Waiblinger**, the winner of the 2014 Frasier Organ Scholarship! Our chapter will present Kirk with the \$1000 award at our Annual Membership Meeting on Sunday afternoon, June 8.

The Frasier auditions were held at Sunnyvale Presbyterian Church on Saturday afternoon, May

10. Two young and very talented organists competed for the award this year. The scholarship decision was based on their written applications, letters of recommendation, and their audition performances.

For his Frasier audition, Kirk performed Fugue in G Major, BWV 577, by J.S. Bach, Grand Choeur Dialogué by Eugene Gigout, Prayer at Midnight (from From the World of My Father) by Herman Berlinski, and the hymn Christ the Lord is Risen Today (Easter Hymn).

Kirk has studied piano for ten years and organ for four years, both with Diane Keller (a member of our chapter – congratulations, Diane!). Kirk is currently a junior at Mountain View High School. He has served as a substitute organist, a ward organist, and as an assistant choir accompanist. He is excited to learn new organ music, enjoys performing, and hopes to eventually hold an organist position. In the meantime, he welcomes opportunities to substitute for church services. As he looks ahead to college, Kirk plans to major in science, with a minor in music and/or organ performance. He plans to use the Frasier scholarship to continue his organ lessons into his college years.

Judging the scholarship auditions this year were Carolyn Pryor, Paul Rosas, and Joyce Rhodes. Our San Jose AGO chapter extends sincere appreciation to them for so generously sharing their time, professional expertise, and musical encouragement with this next generation of organ students. We also thank Sunnyvale Presbyterian Church for graciously allowing the Frasier applicants to practice and prepare their audition pieces there, and for hosting the Frasier auditions.

Congratulations again to Kirk, and we look forward to hearing him play at future chapter events—hopefully at our student recital and perhaps also in a solo recital next year.

PASSING OF LYLE SETTLE

I regretfully need to pass the news to all of you of the passing of one of the oldest and revered Music Ministry members on 9 May 2014 at approximately 6:45pm. Lyle Settle (former member of our group) was the almost unsung organist for the 8:00a.m. service on Sunday mornings. He cheerfully would be at Trinity, usually between 7:15 and 7:30 on Sundays to put in a few minutes warming up for the 8:00a.m. service. He was nearly totally blind, but knew all the hymn harmonizations from memory as well as many, many organ masterpieces which he also would render almost perfectly from memory.

I am not completely sure of the exact nature of his illness, but he needed a serious blood transfusion two weeks ago for his anemia. Then, of course, he was back on the organ bench last Sunday, so cheery and playing so well. I am trying to learn more about Lyle's career, but I do know he has been around Trinity for a very long time; he played for some twenty years at St.

Joe's Cathedral over on Market. I know he was playing for the chapel services of St. Andrew's School just before I started there back in 2010.

Please remember Lyle in your prayers and thoughts! He was a most dedicated church musician and he had such wisdom to pass on about past teachers and professors. If you know more about Lyle, please share it when you can. He will be missed and will be held deeply in many hearts

From Meanie Cervi: I had the pleasure of seeing and playing this organ. It is a very special organ. Yes, it is a bit large. If you google Allen Renaissance R-320, you can find a PDF with the stop list and console measurements. Carl added 5 octaves of pipes (1 rank available at 8' 4' $2^2/_3$ ', 2'). They are voiced very well for the small room and are mounted with 5 speakers in a cabinet (119"x68"x36"). This is mounted on the wall opposite the console. In my opinion, this would be an excellent organ for a teacher. I'm sure that it would please Carl and his family, to know that his organ is bringing joy to many other families.
