UGO SFORZA IN RECITAL OCT. 14



Ugo Sforza, an accomplished Italian organist and composer, will present an organ recital on Friday evening, October 14, at 7:00 pm Sunnvvale **Presbyterian** Church (728 W. Fremont Ave. Sunnyvale 94087). There is no admission charge; donations to Ugo will be received at the door. Mr. Sforza presented a wonderful recital for us the past two autumns, and we are eager to welcome him back to the Bay Area for another inspiring performance. Invite your friends and family to join us for this evening of organ music, and for the reception following.

Ugo's program will include a broad variety of exciting organ repertoire.

He will open his recital with Reger's monumental *Phantasie und Fuge über B.-A.-C.-H.*, op. 46, followed by Franck's exquisitely beautiful *Prelude, Fugue et Variation en Si mineur, op. 18.* Ugo will close his program with three of his original compositions: *Organum Vox Dei, op. 3* (2003), *Sunshine, op. 9* (2012), and a first performance of a new composition, *Triumphal March, op. 18* (2016). Ugo Sforza has earned degrees in organ performance, composition, piano, and cultural heritage (historic keyboard instruments) in Italy and Austria. He has performed organ recitals for concert series and organ festivals in Europe and the U.S.A.

At Sunnyvale Presbyterian, Mr. Sforza will be performing on the 3-manual, 58-rank Balcom & Vaughan instrument built in 1986.

AN EMAIL INTERVIEW WITH UGO SFORZA (CONDUCTED IN SEPTEMBER 2015)

NL: What first started your interest in the pipe organ?

Sforza: When I was 10 years old, in Mai 1992, just I entered a big Church near Bari, hand in hand together with my mother. In few seconds I saw a "big" (actually it is quite small!) musical instrument with two keyboards and strange pedals under the keyboards, very similar to giant keys. It was the first pipe organ I have ever seen. I didn't know pipe organs at that time. Bari is not real the city of pipe organs. Three days later I had my first private piano's lesson.

NL: How old were you when you first started studying the organ seriously?

Sforza: After 3 months getting piano's lessons, I tried both examinations at the Academy of Music in Bari. I was quite unable to play good, but I raised the interest of the Committee on the innate musical abilities, including a perfect pitch; So, they offered my the possibility to choose only one course of studies: organ or piano. I suddenly answered "Please, I want to study the organ!", against the will of my private piano's teacher, that was totally angry with me for this "stupid decision", as he said. So I started with my first organ lesson, directely at the Academy of Music in Bari, in September 1992, when I was 10. I started studying again piano seriously until the age of 22.

NL: Who are some of the most influential teachers with whom you studied?

Sforza: All these 4 teachers, in different ways, they have straightened out my bones one by one:

- Roberto Antonello, organ teacher and performer; deputy general director at the Academy of Music in Vicenza, Italy
- Michael Harris, organ teacher and performer; conductor of the Scottish Chamber Orchestra and Master of the Music in St. Gile's Edinburgh
- Filippo Balducci, piano teacher and performer, Academy of the Music in Bari
- Brett Leighton, organ teacher and performer, University of Linz, Austria

NL: What are some of the more interesting venues in which you have played?

Sincererly, the smallest villages across Europe and U.S.A. These small realities also welcome beautiful organs, as well as the big cathedrals; additionally, there, you meet and feel the beauty and the love of people too! In few words, small places. and great hearts! It is not a mathematical equation, of course. but it often happens, and in Sunnyvale it happened too! I am so very proud and happy to meet again the people in Sunnyvale. Lovely, interested and deep people there.

NL: I know that you have composed quite a bit of music; do you also improvise in a concert?

Sforza: Yes, I often improvise during my concerts. In the last years I was not so happy to do it, because I did not regulary attended official improvisation courses in my

student's carreer. However, all my teachers prayed me to do it the same, so I began and did it... and, nowadays, it seems to make people happy... sometimes!

NL: Can you describe your compositional process?

Sforza: My compositional process is very similar to the improvisation's one. I have just studied 2 months composition at the Academy of Music in Bari. I have always trusted of my teachers. Anyway, I had some troubles with my teacher of composition: she was a well known teacher from Milan and she refused, at the first day of lessons, "to decipher my very old style", as she told me (I had already pubblished some organ works at that time). "Your is not real new music, because it is alrealdy written", she said too. So I refused to continue and study composition. After that, I stop my "useless" compositional process for ten years circa. Than, my organ teacher Roberto Antonello, casually discovered a draft of my "Fantasy on Veni Creator Spiritus" and he conviced me to take and publish it. Thank to him I began again to write music...

Next year, in Austria, will be played and represented my first Lyric Opera.

NL: Who are some of your favorite modern composers?

Sforza: According the style of my music, my favourite modern composers should be all already died at the beginning of 20th century. Actually, sometimes I can also close my eyes and dream, sitted in the Cinema, for some well written motion picture sound tracks... as Brother Sun Sister Moon, Titanic, the Gladiator, The Passion of Christ... A part from digital effects, of course... Could I do it?
